There is little in the world more alluring than a glass of Bordeaux. Centuries of blending mastery, combined with a unique terrain and climate, give birth to this regal wine. In “Bordeaux: The King of Wines,” students will sample several wonderful red and white Bordeaux wines from the districts of Medoc, St. Emilion, Graves, Bordeaux Superieur, and Sauternes, and will learn which foods are ideal pairings with these wonderful wines. The cost of the course is \$115.

In the course, “Delicious Dessert Wines,” students will taste an international selection of dessert wines, along with delicious desserts. Participants will learn the history of these intriguing wines and how they are made, while discovering that there is more to the end of a nice meal than just a cup of coffee! This class also offers exciting ideas for holiday parties. The cost of the course is \$99.

Both courses are taught by wine educator Robert Windorf, who received his formal training in professional wine studies, culinary arts, and culinary journalism at the Culinary Institute of America at Greystone (Napa Valley, California), The French Culinary Institute (New York), The Institute of Culinary Education (New York), The Bordeaux Wine School, New York University, and Windows on the World Wine School.
