The Annenberg Foundation's site at <http://www.learner.org> offers free streaming video aimed at K-12 teachers on a variety of disciplines. One may choose from subjects such as the Arts, Foreign Language, Literature & Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies and History.

From the Annenberg website:

*Annenberg Media's mission is to use media and telecommunications to advance excellent teaching in American schools. This mandate is carried out chiefly by the funding and broad distribution of educational video programs with coordinated Web and print materials for the professional development of K-12 teachers. It is part of The Annenberg Foundation and advances the Foundation's goal of encouraging the development of more effective ways to share ideas and knowledge.*

Annenberg Media's multimedia resources help teachers increase their expertise in their fields and assist them in improving their teaching methods. Many programs are also intended for students in the classroom and viewers at home. All Annenberg Media videos exemplify excellent teaching.

For example, there's a series called The Arts in Education, which is a video library for K-5 classroom teachers and arts specialists. It includes 14 half-hour video programs, a library guide, and Web site. These sources may be viewed at <http://www.learner.org/resources/series165.html>.

To access these videos go to <http://www.learner.org> and choose a subject area under "Interactives" or you can search by a keyword term in the search box. From the subject areas you may also choose grade levels to view. When you scroll down the page, you can click the "VoD" (Video on demand) button to stream the programs. These videos are best viewed in the Internet Explorer browser. Closed Captions are available. One-time individual registration (free) is required.
