Offensive Player of the Week – Tim Gale, Northeastern

(Jr., RB, 6-0, 235 lbs., Boxford, MA/Masconomet Regional HS)
 Gale set a school record and tied an Atlantic 10 record with five rushing touchdowns and gained a career-high 219 yards on the ground in Northeastern's 49-17 victory at New Hampshire...had scoring runs of 2, 17, 2, 6, and 44 yards...his 33 carries equaled a personal high...seven players have rushed for five touchdowns in a game in A-10 history, the last being former Villanova and current Philadelphia Eagles RB Brian Westbrook versus James Madison (10/1/01).



Defensive Player of the Week – Isai Bradshaw, James Madison

(Fr., LB, 6-2, 225 lbs., Cambridge, MA/Cambridge Rindge & Latin HS)
 In James Madison's 34-31 overtime win versus William & Mary, Bradshaw collected a game-high 19 tackles, including two for loss, as well as a sack and fumble recovery...his seven-yard sack came on third down in overtime, forcing the Tribe to attempt a field goal...has registered 58 tackles since being inserted into the starting lineup on Oct. 19.



Rookies of the Week – Steven Cason, William & Mary

(Fr., CB, 6-0, 190 lbs., Richmond, VA/James River HS)
 Cason had perhaps the best performance of his 10-game William & Mary career, recording his third interception of the season, blocking a field goal and totaling 118 yards on four kickoff returns (29.5 avg.)...collected six tackles, including four unassisted...had a career-best 57-yard kickoff return...has 45 tackles on the season.



Kevin McMahan, Maine

(Fr., WR, 6-4, 195 lbs., Rochester, NY/Aquinas HS)
 McMahan had five receptions for a career-high 125 yards and the first two-touchdown game of his career in Maine's 21-14 victory at Richmond...had a seven-yard scoring catch on the Black Bears' opening drive and his 38-yard TD reception with 1:00 remaining in the first half proved to be the difference...has topped 100 yards receiving in each of the last two games.



Special Teams Player of the Week – Gary Johnson, Villanova

(Sr., DB, 5-8, 175 lbs., Waukegan, IL/Francis Parker HS - San Diego, CA)
 Johnson blocked a punt in the second quarter to set up a Villanova touchdown in its 45-3 win over Rhode Island...also blocked a 36-yard field goal attempt...marked the second blocked punt of his career...added two unassisted tackles.

Delaware had a bye on Nov. 16 and hosts Villanova on Sat...the all-time series is tied, 17-17-1...UD snapped its six-game road losing streak, its longest since

1939-40, with a 37-13 win at Maine on Nov. 9...**Scott Collins'** three field goals versus UM tied his own UD record...LB **Dan Mulhern** had nine tackles while his younger brother **John** (seven stops) made his first career start at OLB...QB **Andy Hall** completed 10-of-19 passes for 146 yards. Hall leads the team with 863 rushing yards...freshman WR **Justin Long** leads the team in receptions (46), receiving yards (559) and TD catches (four).

Hofstra Pride



Marques Colston's three-yard TD reception with 2:18 remaining lifted Hofstra past UMass, 31-28...the Pride have won three straight games...QB **Ryan Cosentino** completed 34-

of-55 passes for 364 yards and two touchdowns, his third 300-yard passing game of the season...LB **Cole Haley** posted a game-high 10 tackles...18 of Hofstra's 22 first downs versus UMass came via the pass...WR **Isaac Irby** hauled in a game-high 10 receptions, including a seven-yard TD catch...HOF hosts Liberty on Sat. at 1:30.

James Madison Dukes



Freshman RB **Raymond Hines'** one-yard scoring run in overtime gave James Madison a 34-31 win over William &

Mary, the fifth win in the last six contests for the Dukes over W & M at home...after tossing three scoring passes in its first 10 games, JMU had three TD passes on 10 attempts on Sat...sophomore **Matt LeZotte** had a four-yard scoring pass in the opening quarter, freshman **Jayson Cooke** had a 51-yard scoring strike in the third quarter and **Mike Connelly** tossed a 44-yard TD pass with 7:18 remaining in the fourth quarter...visit NU on Sat. 12:30.

Maine Black Bears



As a result of its 21-14 win at Richmond on Sat., Maine tied a program record for wins (nine) and set a school-record for road wins (five)...senior QB **Jake Eaton** injured his

knee in the second quarter and did not return...sophomore RB **Marcus Williams** rushed for 124 yards, his fifth 100-yard rushing game of the season...**Brandon McGowan** collected a team-high 11 tackles and an INT...host UNH on Sat. at 12:00...with a win, UM would be the first team since UD (1991-92) to win or share the A-10 title in consecutive seasons.

Massachusetts Minutemen



Massachusetts suffered its first home loss of the season on Sat. to Hofstra, 31-28...making his second start in place of injured QB Jeff Krohn,

freshman **Tim Day** completed 9-of-14 passes for 130 yards and a touchdown...freshman TB **R.J. Cobbs** rushed for 89 yards and two scores on 19 carries...the Minutemen limited HOF to nine yards rushing on 28 attempts...LB **Mark Kimener** led UMass with 12 tackles, along with two sacks...freshman **Shannon James** collected seven tackles and picked off his fourth pass of the season, tops among A-10 freshmen...visit URI on Sat. at 12:30.

New Hampshire Wildcats



Despite 249 all-purpose yards and two touchdowns from senior RB **Stephan Lewis**, New Hampshire dropped a 49-17 decision to Northeastern on Sat...Lewis moved into third place on the school's all-time rushing list with 3,646 yards...**R.J. Harvey** totaled 91 yards on three kickoff returns, including a long of 45 yards...senior FS **Czar Wiley** collected 10 tackles and is now seventh in UNH history and first among DB's with 265 career tackles...DB **Brandon Taylor** posted a team-high 12 tackles...visit UM on Sat. at 12:00.

Northeastern Huskies



Northeastern established program records for single-season wins (nine) and A-10 wins (six) after defeating UNH on Sat., 49-17...the Huskies' 49

points and 380 rushing yards were their most ever in an Atlantic 10 contest...leading 21-17 at the half, NU limited UNH to 26 yards of total offense in the second half and found the end zone twice in the third and fourth quarters...MLB **Liam Ezekiel** totaled 16 stops to raise his season total to 130, an NU single-season record...host JMU on Sat. at 12:30...the Huskies' eight-game home-winning streak is the longest active streak in the Conference.

Rhode Island Rams



Rhode Island dropped its fourth straight contest on Sat. at Villanova, 45-3...freshman QB **Jayson Davis** completed 7-of-14 passes for 70 yards and

rushed for 91 yards on 26 carries...Davis raised his rushing total to 679 yards on the season, the highest single-season total by a URI QB in school history...Rhode Island's 2,584 rushing yards are a single-season team record...LB **Keith Peacock** led the Rams with eight stops, including seven unassisted...host UMass on Sat. at 12:30.

Richmond Spiders



Despite collecting 12 tackles for loss, four sacks and forcing two turnovers, Richmond suffered a 21-14 defeat to Maine on Sat. in its final home game of the season...both teams rushed for 144

yards, both had 17 first downs and UM had a two-yard advantage in total offense (324-322)...senior DT **Steve Boyer** recorded eight stops and matched a career-high with five tackles for loss...freshman QB **Stacy Tutt** passed for a career-best 171 yards and rushed for 77 yards, also a career-best...WR **Boyd Ouden** had seven receptions for 145 yards and a touchdown, his seventh scoring reception of the season...visit W & M on Sat. at 12:00, the 112th meeting between the in-state rivals.

Villanova Wildcats



QB **Brett Gordon** became the second player in school history to have two 3,000-yard passing seasons and head coach **Andy Talley** earned career victory No.

150 as Villanova defeated Rhode Island on Sat., 45-3...freshman RB **Martin Gibson** rushed for 58 yards and a TD and totaled 176 all-purpose yards...VU forced five turnovers and collected six sacks, including two each by LB **Dan Silva** and DE **Darrell Adams**...senior LB **Jamison Young** had a game-high 11 tackles...VU scored touchdowns on seven of its first nine possessions and six different players found the end zone...visit UD on Sat. at 1:00.

William & Mary Tribe



Despite totaling 411 yards of total offense and converting 11-of-17 third down opportunities, William & Mary fell to James Madison on Sat. in overtime, 34-

31...senior QB **Dave Corley Jr.** tossed a one-yard scoring pass to **Nick Rogers** with 50 seconds remaining to send the game into the extra session...Corley had three touchdown passes and has now tossed at least two TD passes in eight games this season...WR **Rich Musinski** totaled 56 receiving yards on three receptions, raising his total to 1,045 receiving yards on the season. Musinski is the first Tribe player in school history to top 1,000 yards receiving twice...senior LB **Mohammed Youssofi** collected a team-high 15 tackles...host UR on Sat. at 12:00.

Two Minute Drill...

- Atlantic 10 teams are 11-3 (.786) at home this season in non-conference action, with the three losses coming to nationally ranked opponents (Furman, Hampton and Montana). Overall, Conference teams are 17-4 (.810) versus nonconference opponents, excluding I-A foes.
- Home teams are 29-16 (.644) in Conference action this season.
- The A-10 finished the season 2-5 vs. I-A teams, including the first-ever shutout win over a I-A opponent (NU 31, Ohio 0).
- Of the 45 A-10 games thus far, **16** have been decided by a touchdown or less and the margin of victory in **nine** of the contests has been by three points or less, including three overtime games.
- **Five** Atlantic 10 teams are within a game in the loss column of the top spot in the Conference standings.
- For the third consecutive season, two A-10 programs jumped out to 4-0 starts (Maine & Northeastern). Last season, Rhode Island and Villanova jumped out to 4-0 starts, while Delaware and New Hampshire started off perfect after four games in 2000. Delaware shared the Conference crown with Richmond in 2000, while Villanova was co-champion with Hofstra, Maine and William & Mary last season.
- In the last 10 Atlantic 10 contests, the winning teams averaged a remarkable **35.6 ppg**.
- **Maine** and **New Hampshire** meet for the 92nd time on Sat., not only for bragging rights but possession of the Brice-Cowell Musket. The gun is named for former coaches Fred Brice of Maine and Bill Cowell of New Hampshire. Maine head coach **Jack Cosgrove** (1974-77) was 2-2 in his four games at quarterback for the Black Bears against UNH. New Hampshire head coach **Sean McDonnell**, a defensive back for the Wildcats from 1975-78, was 1-2-1 in his playing career versus UM.
- **Northeastern's** 338 points scored this season are a school record, eclipsing the previous team high of 320, set in 1997. The Huskies have scored 30 or more points in six games this year.
- Delaware senior LB **Dan Mulhern's** stellar career comes to a close on Sat. versus Villanova at UD Stadium. Mulhern enters the game with 411 career tackles, fourth in UD history.

Curtain Calls

- This Sat. marks the final Atlantic 10 contests for three of the finest Atlantic 10 quarterbacks in league history. William & Mary's **Dave Corley Jr.**, Maine's **Jake Eaton** and Villanova's **Brett Gordon** will end their careers in the top 10 in league history in touchdown passes and each have passed for more than 7,500 career yards and completed more than 600 passes. This season, all three seniors have completed better than 57 percent of their passes.
- Long-time Delaware public address announcer **Elbert Chance** has announced that he will retire at the end of the 2002 season, with Saturday's Villanova-Delaware contest marking his final game. The voice of Delaware Stadium since 1953, Chance has missed just five games during his tenure and served as the Sports Information Director (1952-54) and Alumni Director (1956-85) at UD. He was inducted into the University of Delaware Athletics Hall of Fame in 2001.

(A-10 Bylaws, Article VII, Section 1, Subsection 1.05)

If a tie still exists after one of the two tie-breakers is applied (1.03, 1.04), the tie shall be broken by using the following formula:

$(TSN+ESPN)/2 + \text{Sagarin} + \text{Quartile} + \text{Losses}$

TSN= The Sports Network poll

ESPN= ESPN/USA Today poll

Sagarin= Sagarin power ranking of
all division I schools

Quartile= Sagarin schedule strength
divided by 25

Losses= Overall losses

Ties are broken only to determine the A-10 automatic qualifier. Any teams tied for first when the season ends will be declared Atlantic 10 champion.

Playoff Plotting

- Since 1986, when the I-AA playoff field expanded to 16 teams, the A-10 has received 35 bids to the playoffs.

The breakdown is as follows:

- 0 losses in Conference play – 4/4
- 1 loss in Conference play – 15/15
- 2 losses in Conference play – 16/25
- 3 losses in Conference play – 0/26

- Only one time in Atlantic 10 Conference history has the league received three bids in consecutive seasons (1993 & '94). The 2001 season saw three A-10 teams advance to the playoffs.

- Five teams have advanced to the I-AA playoffs with three losses in league play – Boise State (1988), The Citadel (1990), Georgia Southern and Idaho (1995), and Portland State (2000). All five received at-large bids.

- No league has ever sent four teams to the playoffs, although current A-10 members Delaware, James Madison, New Hampshire and Villanova all advanced to the postseason in 1991 before JMU joined the league.

YEAR AFTER YEAR: Richmond and William & Mary will go head-to-head for the 112th time on Sat., the fourth-longest rivalry in I-AA. Below is a look at the longest running series in I-AA:

Schedule Snippets

TAKIN' IT UP A NOTCH: A record seven Atlantic 10 teams will do battle with seven I-A opponents, equaling the most in Conference history. Villanova's 37-19 win over Rutgers on Aug. 31 was the first for an A-10 program over a I-A foe since 2000, when Richmond defeated Arkansas State (30-27) while Northeastern (35-27) and Rhode Island (26-21) defeated Connecticut.

NOT THIS YEAR: The Atlantic 10 scheduling format calls for nine league games, meaning each institution does not face one league foe. The following are the Atlantic 10 "misses" for 2002: Delaware vs. Hofstra, Maine vs. Northeastern, Massachusetts vs. William & Mary, New Hampshire vs. Rhode Island and Richmond vs. Villanova. James Madison will visit Rhode Island on Nov. 2 in a game that counts as a Conference game for Rhode Island only.

SEPT. 7 – WILLIAM & MARY AT MAINE: Besides matching the teams voted 1-2 in the preseason poll by A-10 coaches and media, there were some interesting sidebars as well. UM was 0-5 all-time versus the Tribe, and the Black Bears entered the contest boasting an eight-game winning streak at Morse Field at Alford Stadium. Maine's last home loss came at the hands of W & M in 2000 (31-28). Maine claimed its first-ever win versus the Tribe, 27-14.

SEPT. 21 – JAMES MADISON AT HOFSTRA: The only Atlantic 10 opponent the Pride had not faced since joining the Conference in 2001, JMU defeated Hofstra in double-overtime, 24-21.

SEPT. 21 – MASSACHUSETTS AT NORTHEASTERN: The Minutemen had won 16 consecutive contests over their in-state rivals, including a 7-0 mark since the Huskies joined the Conference in 1993. Not counting the 77-0 nightmare in 1999, the other six games were decided by seven points or less. NU put an end to those streaks with a 42-17 win.

OCT. 19 – VILLANOVA AT MASSACHUSETTS: Maybe the hotels in Amherst and Villanova are to blame, but the road team in this series has lost the last 14 games, with the last road win coming by 'Nova in 1978. The winning team has scored 36-plus points in five of the last six meetings, including 47 by VU in last season's 47-13 victory. UMass extended the streak to 15 wins for the home team in the series with a 17-16 win.

NOV. 16 – RHODE ISLAND AT VILLANOVA: The Rams and Wildcats square off for the first time since 1998. URI is 0-6 all-time at Villanova Stadium and the Wildcats are 9-1 in Atlantic 10 play against Rhody under head coach Andy Talley. VU improved to 7-0 at home all-time versus URI with a 45-3 win.

NOV. 23 – NEW HAMPSHIRE AT MAINE: The 92nd battle for the Brice-Cowell Musket, named for former coaches Fred Brice (UM) and Bill Cowell (UNH). The Black Bears have won three of the last four meetings, scoring 52, 55 and 57 points in their three victories. UM signal caller Jake Eaton strives for his third win versus the Wildcats, one more than Black bears head coach Jack Cosgrove captured during his playing career in Orono (2-2).

NOV. 23 – RICHMOND AT WILLIAM & MARY: The fourth-longest rivalry in I-AA, the in-state rivals will meet for the 112th time in a series that commenced in 1898. The Tribe have claimed seven of the last nine meetings in Atlantic 10 play, including last season's 23-20 contest. Due to rescheduling of games as a result of the Sept. 11 tragedy, it marked the first time the two programs did not meet in the final game of the regular season since 1995. William & Mary and Richmond have closed its regular season with each other 73 times.

NOV. 23 – VILLANOVA AT DELAWARE: First-year head coach K.C. Keeler gets his first crack at arch-rival Villanova, winners of five of the last six meetings. The two storied programs have each won an Atlantic 10 title the past two seasons and have a combined 10 Conference crowns.
