### Streaks, Stats, and Storylines:

- Hofstra enters the 2007-08 campaign looking to make its fourth straight Division I postseason appearance, after earning three straight bids to the NIT. The Pride has never made four straight Division I postseason appearances in program history. Hofstra also had three straight postseason bids from 1999-2001.

- Senior guard Antoine Agudio enters the new season with 1,664 points, ranking him eighth in school history and third amongst active NCAA Division I players. He is on pace to break the school's career scoring mark of 2,222 points, which has stood for 43 years since Steve Nisenon set the mark.

- Senior guard Antoine Agudio enters the new season with 273 career three-pointers, ranking him first in school history and third amongst active NCAA Division I players. He has the first (100 last year), second (91 in 2005-06) and third (82 in 2004-05) highest single-season totals in school history as well.

- Hofstra had the highest scoring backcourt in the country last year, with Loren Stokes (20.3), Antoine Agudio (20.2) and Carlos Rivera (13.4) combining for 53.9 points per game. New Orleans (53.0 ppg) was the only other school that had a three-guard combination averaging at least 50 points per contest. Stokes and Rivera have graduated, leaving Agudio as the lone member of the trio on this season's squad.

- Hofstra won last season's meeting between the schools 65-64 as part of ESPN Bracket Buster Saturday. Graduated guard Carlos Rivera won the game by hitting two free throws with 1.7 seconds left, then blocking an 18-foot Crusader shot at the buzzer.

- Senior guard Antoine Agudio was named to the Preseason All-CAA First Team. He was also named the Preseason CAA Player of the Year by The Sporting News College Basketball Preview and Lindy's College Basketball Preview.

**Last Year's Recap (Hofstra 65, Holy Cross 64):** Senior guard Carlos Rivera (San German, PR) celebrated Senior Day by hitting the game winning foul shots with 1.7 seconds left and adding a blocked shot at the buzzer to lead Hofstra to a 65-64 win over Holy Cross in an O'Reilly ESPNU Bracket Buster game on Saturday afternoon. Rivera and junior guard Antoine Agudio (Huntington Station, NY) tied for team-high honors with 19 points, while senior guard Loren Stokes (Buffalo, NY) added 16. Senior guard Keith Simmons led all scorers with 22 points for Holy Cross. Holy Cross had taken a 64-63 lead with 1:36 left on a put-back from forward Eric Meister. After Stokes was called for a charge, the Pride earned a stop when senior guard Torey Thomas tried to drive baseline, but sophomore forward Chris Gadley (Buffalo, NY) deflected the ball off Thomas' head and out of bounds. Sophomore forward Zygis Sestokas (Vilnius, Lithuania) missed a three-pointer in the corner that Meister rebounded, but he missed both foul shots. Rivera grabbed the defensive rebound, and after a time-out, he forced a shot up under pressure as he was fouled by Thomas with 1.7 seconds left. Holy Cross called timeout, but Rivera swished both foul shots to give the Pride the lead. Holy Cross then threw a pass the length of the court that Simmons caught inside the three-point line, but Rivera blocked his 17-footer as time expired. Hofstra led by as many as eight points in the second half at 56-48, but the Crusaders crawled back in it and pulled even at 59-59 with 3:39 left. Thomas had 16 points and six steals for Holy Cross, while Tim Clifford added 11 before fouling out.

**Pride In Season Openers:** Hofstra is 4-2 in season openers during the Tom Pecora era, although it lost last year's opening game at Charlotte, snapping a three-game opening day win streak. All-time, Hofstra is 41-30 in season openers, including 19-15 in 34 years at the Division I level.

**The Big 2-0:** Hofstra picked up its 20th win of last season against Holy Cross on Feb. 17, the third year in a row that it has reached that plateau. The Pride has won 20 games eight times in 34 years at the Division I level, six of which have come since 1998-99. Hofstra also had three straight 20-win seasons from 1998-99 through 2000-01, when current head coach Tom Pecora was an assistant under Jay Wright. In the last 10 years, Hofstra has won 194 games, an average of 19.4 per season.

**Home, Sweet Home:** Hofstra suffered a rare home defeat on Feb. 8 to Drexel, which snapped a 28-game regular season home win streak, and a 22-game CAA home win streak. The Pride had not lost a regular season home game since a 67-66 defeat to Old Dominion on January 19, 2005. Old Dominion also defeated Hofstra in the 2006 Postseason NIT, snapping an overall 21-game home win streak. Hofstra is now 30-1 in its last 31 regular season home games, and 31-2 in its last 33 overall home games. It is also 70-21 all-time at the renamed Mack Sports Complex (formerly Hofstra Arena) since the building opened on January 2, 2000, and is 86-21 in its last 107 overall home games, dating back to 1997-98 in the old Physical Fitness Center.

**Hofstra in the Postseason:** Last year marked the Pride's third straight NIT appearance and fourth overall. Hofstra has reached the postseason eight times overall in its 34 years at the Division I level, six of which have come since 1999. Hofstra also reached the NCAA Division I Tournament four times (1976, 1977, 2000, 2001). Hofstra has never been made four straight Division I postseason appearances, which it could accomplish this year with an NIT or NCAA bid.

**Pecora Reaches 100 Wins:** Hofstra Head Coach Tom Pecora won his 100th career game in the Pride's victory over George Mason on Feb. 10. His career record currently stands at 103-82 in his six years as the Hofstra Head Coach. After three seasons, his record stood at 34-56, but over the last three seasons, he compiled a 69-26 mark (.726). He now stands in fifth place in Hofstra history with 103 wins.

**Getting Better All The Time:** Hofstra has kept improving its CAA record since joining the league in 2001-02, one year after winning an America East Conference championship in the 2000-01 season. That 2000-01 team had seven seniors on it, though, leaving Hofstra without a senior as it ventured into a new conference. The Pride's first season in the CAA saw it finish tenth at 5-13, although it reached the semifinals of the CAA Tournament. The following year saw the Pride improve to 6-12 in league play (ninth place), and it is has since improved from fifth to fourth to third. Last year, the Pride held steady with the same CAA record (14-4) and seed (third) as in 2005-06.

**Agudio Record Watch:** Senior guard Antoine Agudio (Huntington Station, NY) has a chance to break the Hofstra career scoring record this winter, a mark which has stood for 42 years. Agudio enters his final season with 1,664 points, which already ranks him eighth. The school record of 2,222 was set by Steven Nisenson from 1962-65. Hofstra is guaranteed 30 games this season (29 regular season, one CAA Tournament), which means that Agudio could break the record by averaging 18.7 points per game (if he plays in every contest). A year ago, he averaged 20.2 points per game.

**Agudio Breaks School Record (Again):** Junior guard Antoine Agudio (Huntington Station, NY) made 82 three-pointers as a freshman in 2004-05, breaking the old school record of 81, which was set by Demetrius Dudley in 1992-93 (see chart below). Agudio then broke his own single-season record with 91 in 2005-06, and broke it again last year with an even 100. If he makes 100 three-pointers again this winter, he will break the CAA career record of 371, set by UNCW's Brett Blizzard.

**Agudio Third In Scoring, Three-Pointers:** Senior guard Antoine Agudio (Huntington Station, NY) enters the 2007-08 season ranked third in the country among active players in both career points and three-pointers. His 1,664 points trails only Reggie Williams of Virginia Military Institute (1,861 points) and Jaycee Carroll of Utah State (1,737 points). His 273 three-pointers trails only Chris Lofton of Tennessee (313) and Jack Leasure of Coastal Carolina (300).

**Senior Class:** The Hofstra Class of 2008, including senior guard Antoine Agudio (Huntington Station, NY) and senior swingman Ryan Johnson (Massapequa, NY) has a chance to become the winningest class in Hofstra history this winter. The Pride has won 69 games in the last three seasons, leaving it 22 wins shy of the school record of 91, set by the Class of 2001 (which included Norman Richardson and Roberto Gittens). Hofstra also won 91 games in the four seasons from 1958-62, but that was during the freshman ineligibility era in the NCAA.

**Streiking:** Senior guard Antoine Agudio (Huntington Station, NY) enters the 2007-08 season with a couple of prolonged streaks in tact. Agudio has scored in double figures in each of the last 36 games, and has also hit at least one three-pointer in each of the last 36 games as well. Both streaks date back to the 2006 CAA semifinals, when he was held to five points in a 59-48 win over George Mason. Agudio has also started all 95 games in his Hofstra career.

**Agudio Named To Preseason All-CAA First Team:** Senior guard Antoine Agudio (Huntington Station, NY) was named to the Preseason Colonial Athletic Association First Team in a vote of the league's coaches and media representatives. Agudio was joined on the first team by Virginia Commonwealth's Eric Maynor, Drexel's Frank Elegar, George Mason's Will Thomas and Delaware's Herb Courtney.

**Hofstra Picked Fifth In Preseason Poll:** The Hofstra Men's Basketball team was picked to finish fifth in the Colonial Athletic Association in a vote of the league's coaches and media representatives, it was announced at the CAA Media Day on Oct. 18. George Mason, which returns all five starters, was picked to win the CAA, while defending champion Virginia Commonwealth was picked second. Old Dominion was third in the poll, followed by Drexel and Hofstra in the fourth and fifth spots.

### Hofstra Joins Elite Company With Third Festival Title:

The Pride earned the championship of the Aeropostale Holiday Festival last season on Dec. 28-29 with wins over St. Joseph's (65-63) and St. John's (63-51), continuing its storied history at the tournament. Hofstra won back-to-back championships in 1998 and 1999, and nearly captured a third straight title in 2000 before it fell in the title game to Penn State 74-71. With three Holiday Festival championships, the Pride is now in third place all-time for most titles in the 55-year history of the event, behind only St. John's (14) and Manhattan (4). St. John's, though, has made 41 appearances at the event and Manhattan has made 19, compared to only five for the Pride. The other schools with multiple titles include Kentucky, Providence, North Carolina State, Cincinnati, Ohio State, Duquesne and Penn. Hofstra will attempt to win its fourth Holiday Festival this season, opening up with a game against Virginia Tech on Friday, Dec. 28.

### Hofstra Earns Fourth Straight Win Over St. John's:

Hofstra's 63-51 win over St. John's in the Aeropostale Holiday Festival championship game was its fourth in a row over the Red Storm. St. John's has long been known as the premier college basketball program in the New York metropolitan area, but the Pride has been able to perhaps steal the crown of late. St. John's completely dominated the series in the 1900's, winning all 19 meetings between the schools. In the 2000's, though, the Pride has won five of the seven meetings, including the last four in a row (all four coming by double-digit margins). The five wins have also come at four different sites – the Pride has won at Nassau Coliseum (2000), Carnesessa Arena (2003, 2005), Hofstra Arena (2004) and Madison Square Garden (2006).

**Sestokas Joins Three-For-All:** Hofstra entered last season knowing it had plenty of three-point weapons in its arsenal, led by all-time school record holder Antoine Agudio (Huntington Station, NY) and graduated senior guard Carlos Rivera. However, Zygis Sestokas (Vilnius, Lithuania) stepped up last year to give the Pride yet another three-point weapon in its outside arsenal. Sestokas began the year with a career-high 16 points at Charlotte, then broke it with 18 points on six three-pointers in a win at Alaska-Anchorage. Sestokas made 44.4 percent of his threes last season (60 of 135), which led the Pride and ranked second in the CAA.

**20-20 Vision:** Loren Stokes (Buffalo, NY) and Antoine Agudio (Huntington Station, NY) both averaged over 20 points per game last year (Stokes – 20.3 ppg, Agudio – 20.2

ppg). They were the only teammates in the country who averaged over 20 points in 2006-07.

**Exhibition Recap:** Senior guard Antoine Agudio (Huntington Station, NY) had 25 points and six assists to lead the Hofstra Men's Basketball team to an 87-77 win over Northwood in an exhibition game on Thursday, Nov. 1 at the Mack Sports Complex. Agudio shot 8-11 from the floor and 7-10 at the line to score his 25 points. Freshman guard Charles Jenkins had 17 points on 7-12 shooting from the floor in his first game in a Pride uniform. Junior forward Arminas Urbutis (Kaunas, Lithuania) had 11 points on 4-4 shooting to go along with seven rebounds. Junior point guard Greg Johnson (Harlem, NY) chipped in with a solid all-around effort with nine points, seven rebounds, six assists and five steals. Northwood, which was led by a game-high 29 points from Providence transfer DeSean White, battled Hofstra most of the way, taking a 70-68 lead with 5:49 left. However, Urbutis scored down low off a pass from junior forward Darren Townes (New York, NY) and junior guard Zygis Sestokas (Vilnius, Lithuania) gave the Pride the lead for good at 73-70 on a three-pointer off a kick-out pass from Johnson with 4:52 to go.

**Pride Has Highest Scoring 2006-07 Backcourt:** During the 2006-07 season, Hofstra's three-man backcourt of senior Loren Stokes (Buffalo, NY), junior Antoine Agudio (Huntington Station, NY) and senior Carlos Rivera (San German, PR) averaged a combined 53.9 points, with Stokes (20.3 ppg) and Agudio (20.2 ppg) both over 20 points per game, and Rivera (13.7) also in double figures. That combined 53.9 points per game average ranked Hofstra tops in the nation, just ahead of New Orleans (53.0).

**Agudio Aims For 2,000 Points:** Loren Stokes became the fifth player in school history to score 2,000 points last year, reaching the milestone on Feb. 8 against Drexel. Senior guard Antoine Agudio (Huntington Station, NY) enters the new season needing just 336 points to join Stokes in the exclusive 2,000-point club.

**Odds And Ends:** Some strange, unusual, and sometimes relevant facts regarding the Hofstra Men's Basketball program:

**Defense Tells The Story:** Hofstra is 61-2 in the last 63 games (6-0 last year) when it has held its opponents to less than 60 points. In a strange coincidence, both losses in that stretch have been in the Postseason NIT, a 53-44 loss to Saint Joseph's in 2005 and a 58-45 loss to Rutgers in 1999. It almost happened again in 2006 in the NIT, but Old Dominion hit enough foul shots in the final minute to capture a 61-51 win over the Pride in the NIT quarterfinals. Hofstra has won 72 regular season games in a row when holding opponents below 60. In addition, last year Hofstra was 18-1 when holding opponents below 70 (with the only loss coming in the CAA Tournament to George Mason).

**Defense Tells The Story (Part II):** Hofstra gave up 82.6 points per game in its losses last year. In its wins, opponents scored only 63.9 points per game, a difference of almost 20 points. Opponents also shot 50.1 percent from the floor in Hofstra losses, compared to 41.1 percent in wins.

**Homewreckers:** Hofstra won 21 straight home games over the 2004-05 and 2005-06 seasons before seeing the streak end with a loss to Old Dominion. The Pride's last previous home loss was also to Old Dominion on Jan. 19, 2005. However, turnaround is fair play as Old Dominion compiled a 28-2 home record over the 2004-05 and 2005-06 seasons. The team that gave it both home losses? Hofstra.

**Unlucky Seven:** Hofstra has had five six-game win streaks in the last two seasons, but has lost the seventh game each time. Three years ago (2004-05), though, the Pride had a nine-game win streak and a seven-game win streak. Overall, Hofstra has had seven winning streaks of six or more in the last three years, matching the total from its first 31 years at the Division I level combined.

**Beyond The Arc:** Hofstra has made at least one three-pointer in 322 consecutive games, dating back to a loss at Boston University in 1996-97. The closest the Pride came to not making one in recent years was in the 2005-06 season opener, when Antoine Agudio made the first one with just over nine minutes to play in a win over Florida International.

**Liking Their Odds:** 2144 of the Pride's 2339 points (91.7%) last season were scored by players with odd jersey numbers, including 68 of 71 in its finale in the NIT against DePaul.

**Working Overtime:** Hofstra is 14-3 in its last 17 overtime games, dating back to the 1990-91 season, with Drexel accounting for two of the losses in Hempstead in the last three years (2004-05, 2006-07). Those are also two of only three regular season home losses the Pride has suffered in the last three years, along with a 2004-05 loss to Old Dominion.

**Saved By The Buzzer:** Hofstra defeated Holy Cross 65-64 on Feb. 18, when the Crusaders had their game-winning shot attempt blocked at the buzzer. Over Pecora's six seasons, opponents are now 0-14 on meaningful (tying or winning) buzzer beaters, including his first three collegiate wins as a head coach in 2001-02 (against Florida Atlantic, Kent State and Illinois State). Hofstra has had game-winning three-pointers from Aurimas Kieza (vs. ODU in 2005-06) and Carlos

Rivera (vs. Columbia in 2003-04), but overall Hofstra (2-16) and opponents (0-14) have combined to shoot 2-30 on meaningful buzzer-beaters in the Pecora Era. That figure does not count desperation shots beyond 25 feet.
