## SOFTBALL SUMMER CAMP

We, at Hofstra Softball, are dedicated to providing intensive instruction that is essential to the development of the young softball player, whether at the beginner or advanced level. The coaches are responsible for drilling the fundamental skills while providing continuous feedback to the athletes. Most of the skill work is preceded by "master lessons" given by the Hofstra University Softball Coaching Staff. In addition to fundamental skills, we spend a considerable amount of time on teaching the finer points of "position play."

**DISCOUNTS:** A \$10 discount is awarded per camper for 5 or more registering together. All campers registrations must be submitted in the same envelope. No exceptions.

A \$25 discount is awarded to campers registering for more than one session.

**REFUNDS:** There will be no refunds if Hofstra Softball is not notified earlier than one week before the session begins.

## CAMP DESCRIPTIONS

The Hofstra Softball Summer Camp is for the serious softball player who wants to take their game to the next level. Below you will find 2 different clinics that will meet the needs of every softball player.

Camp runs Monday — Wednesday  
9:00am — 4:00pm at the Hofstra Softball Stadium



SESSION I: FUNDAMENTAL SKILLS CAMP  
July 6—8, 2009 Ages: 13—18 years

Instructional groups separated by ages and skill level. Emphasizing fundamental skills (fielding, throwing, footwork, catching and hitting) preceded by “master lessons”. Considerable amount of time teaching the finer points of “position play”.



SESSION II: PITCHING/CATCHING SKILLS CAMP  
July 13—15, 2009 Ages 13-18 years

Pitching: Groups and instruction are based upon age and skill level. Drills for technique, accuracy, conditioning and speed. How to throw “stuff” and different pitching strategies. Pitchers will not have to provide a catcher.

Catching: Come improve your game behind the plate. Throwing, blocking, framing, signals, tag-plays, bunt coverage, steals, pick-offs and more! Catchers must bring their own equipment.

## CAMP STAFF

Bill Edwards, Head Softball Coach, Hofstra University  
Bill Edwards is in his 20th season as Hofstra University Head Softball Coach, and he has been the architect of a program that has grown to national prominence. He has led Hofstra to the regional finals of the NCAA Tournament in both the 2004, 2005 and 2008 seasons, and has helped the Pride capture a remarkable eleven straight conference tournament titles from 1998-2008. Edwards has been named the Regional Coach of the Year nine times in his career (1993, 1994, 1997, 2000, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2007, 2008).

Edwards and company have garnered ten NCAA Tournament appearances (1993, 1995, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008), seven Colonial Athletic Association Championships (2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008), five America East Championships (1995, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001), two East Coast Conference Championships (1992 and 1994), and an ECAC Championship (1993). In each of the last 17 seasons under Edwards, the Pride has won either a regular season or a postseason conference title, including record eleven straight tournament championships. Hofstra has also captured both the regular season and the postseason CAA championships in all seven seasons of the league's existence.

Edwards, who has been a part of 19 straight winning seasons at Hofstra, coached the Pride to a #21 ranking in the final 2004 NCAA Division I Softball Poll, and a #20 ranking in the final 1994 poll. He has also led the Pride to #1 rankings in the Northeast Region Poll in 1993, 1994, 1997 and 2000.

Larissa Anderson, Associate Head Softball Coach, Hofstra University  
Anderson enters her eighth year on the coaching staff at Hofstra, and her fifth as Associate Head Coach, after spending her previous three years as an assistant. She is recognized as one of the premier teachers in the game and one of the top up and coming young coaches in the country. She has helped the Pride to seven CAA Tournament championships and six NCAA Tournament appearances in her first seven seasons on the staff. She has also helped the Pride win ten NCAA Tournament games in the last five years, including four in 2004. She has been a part of a Hofstra staff that has won the Mid-Atlantic Region Coaching Staff of the Year Award from the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007.

Ryan Realmuto, Assistant Softball Coach, Hofstra University  
A former four-time All-Big 12 catcher at Oklahoma State, Ryan Realmuto is entering her third season as an assistant coach at Hofstra after being hired in August of 2006. Realmuto played for the New York/New Jersey Juggernaut of the National Pro Fastpitch (NPF) league in the summer of 2005, which played its home games at Hofstra. She hit 10 home runs for the Juggernaut, ranking her third in all of the NPF, while also leading the team with 27 RBI. Realmuto played college softball at Oklahoma State University from 2000-2003, earning All-Big 12 status in all four seasons. She was a National Fastpitch Coaches Association All-Regional selection as a junior and senior, and was twice chosen to the Big 12's All-Academic team. She graduated in 2003 with a degree in education from Oklahoma State University.

ADDITIONAL STAFF: Current Division I Hofstra Softball players will be helping with the instruction as well as demonstrating the skills necessary to take your game to the next level.
