is now accepting submissions for its first upcoming issue in 2009. The **KANT YEARBOOK** is an international journal that publishes articles on the philosophy of Immanuel Kant. It is the **KANT YEARBOOK**'s goal to intensify innovative research on Kant on the international scale. For that reason the **KANT YEARBOOK** prefers to publish articles in English, however also articles in German will be accepted. Each issue will be dedicated to a specific topic. The first issue's topic is

KANT'S TELEOLOGY

All papers, historical or systematic, related to **KANT'S TELEOLOGY** are welcome though there is a preference for the following themes: The theory of organized beings and the concept of life ('Critique of Judgment', §§64-66), the antinomy of teleological judgment, the doctrine of the postulates, the final purpose, modalities (§76), intuitive understanding, archaeologist of nature (§80), the problem of the two introductions, teleology in history, Kant's teleology in German Idealism, Kant's teleology and the theory of evolution/Darwinism, Kantian teleology and modern biology.

The **KANT YEARBOOK** practices double-blind review, i.e. the reviewers are not aware of the identity of a manuscript's author, and the author is not aware of the reviewer's identity. Submitted manuscripts must be anonymous; that is the authors' names and references to their work capable of identifying them are not to appear in the manuscript.
