# 2009 Reading Miscue Analysis Conference

The 2009 Reading Miscue Analysis Conference is a national forum exploring current reading research and applications to learning and teaching. The conference addresses current research studies, including eye movement miscue analysis (EMMA), text analysis, and RMA procedures engaging readers in the research process. Applications of miscue analysis research for classrooms, evaluation, bilingual readers and struggling readers are also discussed. A variety of presentations and small group work provide participants with opportunities to share ongoing projects and explore research and teaching interests.

## Five Days of Miscue Analysis

The five-day conference includes presentations by faculty and invited speakers on current topics in reading research and practice. General sessions, workshops and mini-courses provide a range of opportunities for participants.

- ▶ Discuss applications of miscue analysis for teaching and evaluation.
- ▶ Refine and expand understandings in a research workshop.
- ▶ Collaborate with teacher-educators and reading clinic directors.
