This spring, as we make plans to host the October 15 presidential debate, the third and final debate produced by the Commission on Presidential Debates for the 2008 election, our thoughts turn to politics, while still offering a rich and varied calendar of academic lectures, music, theater and educational programs.

A highlight of the spring will be a one-day symposium in April, hosted by the Peter S. Kalikow Center for the Study of the Presidency, titled *From Votes to Victory: Winning and Governing the White House in the 21st Century*. This will be one of the many such programs that will be offered to the public and our students in the months leading up to the election.

Our commitment to all academic programs remains steadfast. In March, Hofstra Law School presents a major conference titled *Embryonic Stem Cells, Clones and Genes: Science, Law, Politics and Values*. The School of Education and Allied Human Services continues its series of programs that benefit educators, school administrators and the general public, including our vibrant Institute for the Development of Education in the Advanced Sciences (IDEAS), which welcomes, among others, astronaut Joe Tanner to discuss *A View From Space* and the Climate Institute's chief scientist, Michael McCracken, to explain *The Increasing Pace of Climate Change and Its Impacts*.

The Department of Drama and Dance returns to the renowned Globe Stage in the John Cranford Adams Playhouse to present Shakespeare's *Hamlet*. The Shakespeare Festival also includes a *Hamlet* symposium, performances by the Hofstra Collegium Musicum, and the companion piece *This Bud of Love*.

The Joseph G. Astman International Concert Series spring 2008 schedule, titled *Spring, Sing, Swing*, includes a musical tribute to Nat King Cole and a concert dedicated to Broadway's big band swing vocalists. Hofstra's Department of Music continues its tradition of producing a full concert schedule, including opera, orchestra, chamber and jazz performances.

A glance through this calendar will provide you with an outline of the varied and rich cultural opportunities available this spring on Hofstra's campus, whether you want to explore culture and religion through our lecture series, understand the full expression of an artist's lifetime of work at the Hofstra University Museum, or join us for a reading by a celebrated author at the "Great Writers, Great Readings" series.

I encourage you to continue in a lifetime of learning and join us for some of our excellent cultural programs.

Human activities, primarily the combustion of coal, oil and natural gas, are increasing the atmospheric concentrations of heat-trapping gases. These changes in atmospheric composition have initiated global climate change. Sharply limiting national and global emissions over the next several decades will be required to stop the rise in atmospheric carbon dioxide concentration. The goal is to prevent global warming from causing catastrophic consequences such as a rise in sea level of a few feet this century, and tens of feet over coming centuries.
