Yonia Fain: The Eye of the Storm

Come to Emily Lowe Gallery for a viewing of *The Eye of the Storm*, a documentary about artist Yonia Fain whose work is the subject of the exhibition *Yonia Fain: Remembrance*. Narrated by playwright Harold Pinter and including interviews with the artist, this film examines the ways that Fain's life history and experience with the Holocaust have influenced his art. On May 8, the Museum offers an opportunity for visitors to enjoy a guided viewing of the exhibition along with the documentary.
