The thought of using microfilm probably makes you cringe, but sometimes it's the only game in town. Did you know that some of the resources you may have used are available as digital microfilm? The *New York Times* and the *Wall Street Journal* are available as digital microfilm which can be accessed electronically by following links in the online catalog (see below). They cannot be searched like online databases. Instead, searching entails choosing a year, month, and day much like old-fashioned microfilm. Use *Academic Search Premier* to determine the correct issue for coverage of a particular topic. The images can be brightened, enlarged, or the contrast increased/decreased if necessary. Printing and downloading are supported.
