A large portion of the collection was donated by Paulette C. Greene, librarian, book seller and collector, and her husband, Robert J. Greene. They initially loaned and later donated material that was used in the Richard Nixon Presidential Conference Exhibition, which was on display during Hofstra University's Sixth Annual Presidential Conference in 1987. The Greenes later donated materials concerning other U.S. Presidents, the bulk of which focused on President John F. Kennedy.

Other material in the collection was obtained by staff members from the Hofstra Museum and the Special Collections Department. These materials, some of which were obtained from the National Archives and the Carter and Ford presidential libraries, were also used in presidential conference exhibitions.

The collection includes broadsides, bulletins, correspondence, ephemera, memorabilia, news clippings, newspapers, pamphlets, periodicals, photographs, political editorial cartoons, press kits, press releases, print material, programs, publications, recordings, and research material.

Noteworthy items include Nixon-era political editorial cartoons, White House inauguration programs and invitations, and a 1951 United States Senate Chamber admissions pass signed by Richard Nixon.
