Hofstra University hosted the third and final 2008 presidential debate on October 15, 2008, at the David S. Mack Sports Complex and Exhibition Hall. The university used this occasion to organize numerous events to educate both students and the larger community as well as encourage their involvement in the political process. To this end, Hofstra hosted Educate '08, comprising a series of lectures, seminars, conferences, town hall meetings and exhibitions that focused on policy discussions of campaign issues and history of presidential politics. Guests invited to share their insights on various topics with the university community included David Gergen, George Stephanopoulos, Gloria Steinem, Maureen Dowd, William Kristol, Dr. Allen Weinstein, Dr. Shashi Tharoor, Mario Cuomo and Richard Haass.

The 2008 presidential election was an event of immense historical significance in American democratic politics. Irrespective of the election's outcome, history would have been made. On the Democratic ticket, the eventual winner, Senator Barack Obama of Illinois, is the first African American to ascend to the highest office in the land. His opponent, the Republican candidate, Senator John McCain of Arizona, had he won, at age 72, would have been the oldest president ever elected. Senator McCain's running mate, Governor Sarah Palin of Alaska, would have been the first female vice president.

The individual stories of the candidates as well as their policy positions were compelling campaign themes. Issues of race, age, gender and politics came to the fore at every turn. Coupled with contemporary events like the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan, and a severe national economic crisis arguably comparable to that of the Great Depression, the occurrence of these dynamic events during the campaign season provided teaching moments of our democratic political process at work in real time.

The Debate '08 collection features items such as brochures, flyers, posters, DVDs and print material that chronicle many of the Educate '08 events. In addition, the collection contains debate memorabilia such as bags, decals, badges, stationery and a windbreaker, specifically designed to mark the celebration of this unique moment in American presidential politics. The commemorative gold coin of Hofstra University's 50th anniversary tossed to determine the first presidential candidate questioned in the debate is part of the collection. Specially-ordered Schott Zwiesel glasses used by the candidates on stage are included in the collection. Preparatory events held by the university in anticipation of this occasion, the debate, and post-election news are captured in both online and print media, and form part of the collection. Further, pictures of President-elect Barack Obama, after his victory on the night of November 5, 2008, appear in both local Long Island newspapers, like

, and *The New York Times*. The victory speech delivered by President-elect Obama on that night is also included.
