Biographical note

Louis Stanton Auchincloss was born on September 27, 1917, in Lawrence, NY, to parents Priscilla Dixon and Joseph Howland Auchincloss. He began his career early, by writing for and editing school publications during his time at the prestigious Groton School in Massachusetts, and then at Yale University. He later graduated from the University of Virginia Law School to become an estate lawyer on Wall Street with the firm Sullivan and Cromwell. He had three sons: John, Andrew, and Blake, with his wife Adele. Like her husband, Adele Auchincloss was also an active member in the literary world and in New York society, especially as an artist and environmentalist. Louis Auchincloss was the Chairman and President of the Museum of the City of New York, among other non-literary ventures.

Louis Auchincloss published many works during his long and respected career as an author. He wrote novels, short stories, and reviews, focusing on the American East Coast upper-class and Wall Street bankers, lawyers, and stock brokers. He exposed, to his readers, the lifestyles of those upper-class elites that he himself was a part of, and was occasionally criticized by his peers for doing so. Auchincloss remains a celebrated and widely-read novelist whose writing style is often compared to that of James Joyce. He wrote briefly under the pseudonym Andrew Lee. Louis Auchincloss continued to write nearly until his death on January 26, 2010.

Scope and Content note

This collection is composed of biographical materials on Louis Auchincloss, as well as many of his published works, manuscripts, and other related items. The biographical materials include various news clippings, family photographs, correspondence, and two catalogs from Groton School. With these are several letters exchanged by Acosta Nichols, a librarian at Groton School, and Ellsworth Mason, a librarian at Hofstra University and friend of Auchincloss. Furthermore, Louis and Adele Auchincloss were featured in a magazine article, *The Tastemakers*, highlighting their personalities and New York lifestyle.

A number of Auchincloss' publications, in the form of magazines, newspapers and clippings, have been collected. There are also reviews of his work, reviews written by Auchincloss on other authors, news clippings, and other articles in reference to Auchincloss. Auchincloss compiled several bibliographies of his own work through 1970, which clearly show the evolution of his writing, as well as the relationships between his short stories and articles, which were later incorporated into larger works.

Ellsworth Mason, a former Director of Library Services at Hofstra, was a good friend of Louis Auchincloss, as well as a scholar and collector of his work. A very interesting set of their correspondence from 1965-1970 illustrates their personal and working relationship. In 1967 Mason asked his friend to lecture at Hofstra University on the topic of Edith Wharton, a well known author whom Auchincloss both studied and wrote about. For this lecture Mason curated an exhibit in the Hofstra Library on Auchincloss, his family, and his work. The collection contains the original exhibit description, captions, and two photographs of the exhibit cases Mason assembled. Many, but not all, of the items throughout this collection were included in that exhibit. Finally, there are four original handwritten and typed manuscripts about Edith Wharton, as well as the speech on Wharton given at Hofstra University.
