David L. Hurwood was born David L. Hurwitz in New York City in 1922. He was the son of Henry Hurwitz, Sr. (1886-1961), educator and editor of the *Menorah Journal*, and writer and lecturer Ruth Sapinsky Hurwitz (pen name Sapin). Ruth Hurwitz also tutored (in the family's New York City apartment) German and French Jews who escaped from Europe during the mid-1930s. Hurwood had one sibling, Henry Hurwitz, Jr. (1918-1992), a research physicist who worked on plans for the hydrogen bomb and later helped develop nuclear plants.

Hurwood attended Cornell University, where, among other things, he took compulsory R.O.T.C. classes. Eager to fight in World War II, he finished his studies in three years, graduating with an A.B. degree in 1943. He then served in the U.S. Third Army in the European Theatre of Operation, where he saw combat on the front lines and rose to the rank of captain in the field artillery.

In the mid-1960s, Hurwood experienced a self-described “awakening” in which he became opposed to “U.S. militarism and everything associated with it.” He became active in the peace, resistance and civil rights movements, and he supported dozens of groups dedicated to those causes. He was also a member of a number of these groups, including the Veterans for Peace in Vietnam, with whom he marched in Washington, D.C., in 1967, and the Jewish Peace Fellowship, which he once described in a letter as “the cause closest to my heart.”

Hurwood was extremely devoted to these movements, especially from the mid-1960s through the 1970s. He subscribed to and read numerous publications that produced “movement literature” and he often expressed his views, in writing, to politicians, members of the media and the clergy. Hurwood also made a great number of small contributions to the various groups and organizations that he supported.

In the 1980s, Hurwood continued on supporting his favorite causes and also took on a few new ones, including the anti-nuclear movement and the preservation of the environment.

In his professional life, Hurwood worked in marketing and advertising research for a number of companies, including Young & Rubicam (prior to March 1957), Anderson & Cairns, Inc. (appointed director of marketing and advertising research in March 1957) and Geyer, Morey, Ballard, Inc. (starting in February 1965). As of March 1968, and possibly earlier, Hurwood was employed by the National Industrial Conference Board (NICB), which, in 1970, became known as The Conference Board, where he researched and wrote about business management.

In 1979, Hurwood's paper “Eleventh Street and Bronx Frontier: Urban Pioneering with Wind Power” appeared in *Proceedings of Condensed Papers, 2nd Miami International Conference on Alternative Sources*. Listed beneath his name on the title page was “Energy Economics & Alternatives,” which, around this time, also appeared as part of his address

on mailings from the U.S. Department of Energy to his New York City residence. It is unknown if this was an employer, an organization to which he belonged, or an endeavor that he started on his own.

The majority of the collection, which spans the years 1950-1985, consists of Hurwood's "movement" materials, including personal correspondence and notes, subject files, publications, printed materials, postcards and notecards, news clippings/magazine articles, newsprints, and a large number of newspapers and magazines, including *Granma* and *Cuba*.

Also included is a small amount of material from Hurwood's professional life at Geyer, Morey, Ballard, Inc., and at The Conference Board. Included are charts from *Road Maps of Industry*, conference agendas, and publications and printed materials.

The David L. Hurwood Collection is arranged in eleven series:

- I. Personal correspondence and notes, 1960-1982.
Material is arranged chronologically. Includes correspondence concerning Hurwood's subscriptions and contributions to various movement publications. Also includes some correspondence with members of various organizations.
- II. Subject files, 1961-1982.
Material is arranged alphabetically, then chronologically. Includes news clippings, form letters/donation requests, flyers, newsletters and printed materials. Files are titled by format, subject or name of organization.
- III. Publications, 1950-1985.
Consists of books and booklets that are separated into boxes of two sizes: 9 x 3 x 6" and 11 x 3 ½ x 6". Material is arranged chronologically, then alphabetically.
- IV. Printed materials, 1960-1982.
Material is arranged chronologically. Includes newsletters, leaflets, flyers, pamphlets, and periodicals.
- V. Postcards and notecards, c.1960s-c.1970.
Material is arranged chronologically. Includes handmade notecards and postcards made in Vietnam. Also includes Vietnam War postcards and postcards featuring Ho Chi Minh.
- VI. News clippings/magazine articles, 1965-1982.
Material is arranged under two headings:
 1. *Ramparts* magazine, 1965-1971.
 2. General, 1951, 1960-1982. Includes news clippings and magazine articles from various publications.
- VII. Newspapers and magazines, 1966-1982.
Material is arranged alphabetically, then chronologically. A majority of the material deals with the Vietnam War.
- VIII. Newsprints, 1965-1981.
Material is arranged alphabetically.
- IX. The Conference Board, 1960-1978.
Material is arranged alphabetically by format, then chronologically. Includes charts from *Road Maps of Industry*, conference agendas, information bulletins, and publications and printed materials.
- X. Geyer, Morey, Ballard, Inc, 1965.
Material is arranged chronologically in one folder. Includes correspondence and memos.
- XI. Energy Economics & Alternatives, 1980-1981.
Material is arranged chronologically in one folder. Includes U.S. Department of Energy periodicals and printed materials
