A pply for Graduation on time
B e mindful of each of the symbols/abbrev on your DAR (+, -, IP, TR, LT, CC)
"C" is the key- 2.0 Minimum for Hofstra University
D istribution
E LED needs 93 Liberal Arts credits-not 94 as stated by HCLAS co-major
F oreign Language Requirement/ Special Language Option
G o see your MAJOR DEPARTMENT for Major Advising
H ave your Hold Status Checked before registration
I n-Progress courses do not count towards class standing (ie. FR, SO, JR, SR)
J ot down a list of possible back-up classes to have when registering
K eeP "electives" in mind when monitoring degree progress
L iberal Arts credits needed depends on Major- check your DAR
M ajor- You cannot take more than 45 credits in Liberal Arts major
Minor - You must have one if you are in the School of Communications
N o more than 8 credits in PESP skills towards overall degree total
O btain a list of pre-req's needed for distribution and major courses
P ass/D/D+/Fail - Recognize the advantages and limitations of this option
Q uickly print out DAR before meeting with your advisor
R esidency at Hofstra- 15cr in major; 6cr in minor; LAST 30cr overall
S chedule an appt. to go over non-major related questions

Transferred credits doesn't always equal applicable credit
Use the Hofstra Portal to find your DAR, register, and gain information
Verify that your major(s) and minor(s) are listed on your DAR
WSC 1 and 2 require C- or better... and take the Writing Proficiency Exam
eXamine DAR before and after registration each semester
You are ultimately responsible for your degree progress and completion
Zero credits or requirements left = Graduation? Not Necessarily!

To Run A DAR:

1. Log onto My Hofstra portal
2. Click Hofstra Online Tab
3. Click the link to Student Records
4. Scroll down to the Student DAR option
5. ****Note: your DAR will default to your declared major. If you are in the system as undeclared, you will need to use the "What If" option for your desired major****

What-If? DAR Option:

1. If you are considering a change in major, a "What If?" audit can give you a glance at which requirements your current credits will fulfill.
2. Click on What If? button, select the new degree, new major, term, Submit and Run Analysis
