



PRIVATE STUDENT LOAN APPLICANT SELF-CERTIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS

The Federal Government mandates that private student loan lenders require borrowers to complete a Self-Certification form when applying for a private student loan. Do not submit your Self-Certification form to this office as Hofstra University cannot complete this form for you. You must submit the completed form to your private student loan lender.

The following section of the Self-Certification form must be completed from your latest financial aid award notice. You can access your financial aid award notice online through the Hofstra portal (My.Hofstra.edu).

How can you find your cost of attendance and estimated financial assistance information?

Access the Hofstra portal at <http://my.hofstra.edu> and log in.

1. Go to the Navigation menu on left side, and click on the **Hofstra Online** tab.
2. Scroll down to the **Financial Aid** bar.
3. Click on **View Overall Status of Financial Aid**.
4. Select **Aid Year** from drop down menu, click submit.
5. Scroll down to view your **Cost of Attendance**. **Cost of Attendance** is the total of Books/Supplies, Miscellaneous budget items, Room/Board, Stafford Fees, Tuition/Fees and Transportation costs.
6. Click on **Award Summary by Aid Year** at the bottom of the page.
7. Click on **Award Overview** tab at the top of the page to view your Financial Aid Awards. The Estimated Financial assistance is the total of all your Financial Aid including any loans that you see on your financial aid award.
7. Be sure that the correct academic award year matches the loan period.

Reminder: You must sign the form and return to your lender. Always check to see if you can E-Sign the form on your lender's web site.

ONLY FOR STUDENTS WHO DO NOT HAVE FINANCIAL AID AWARDS

If you **did not** file the FAFSA or you **do not** have a financial award letter, then the cost of attendance table(s) below is the best estimate for you to use. There are three different tables; the first table represents the cost of attendance for new and second year Undergraduate students who entered Hofstra University after Fall 2011. The second table represents the cost of attendance for continuing Undergraduate Hofstra students who entered Hofstra University prior to Fall 2011. The third table represents the cost of attendance for Graduate students.

Lenders will verify your information with Hofstra University via school certification request. It's important for you to understand that you cannot receive more financial aid funds (including loans) than your total cost of attendance regardless of the source of those funds.
