He defined himself by winning while playing lacrosse – and now, retired from the game at age 49, he continues to feel the need to win just as his body needs air; water and food. This singular combination of skill, will, intensity and intelligence add up to the creation of Vinnie Sombrotto – an insuperable athlete."

James C. Metzger

James C. Metzger played high school lacrosse at Half Hollow Hills East for Coach Lou DiBlasi, Hofstra Class of 1961. He led the team in both points and assists in the 1976 and 1977 seasons. While at Half Hollow Hills East, he set school records for most points in a season as well as for most assists in a game, season and career. In 1977 Jim earned High School All-America honors, was the League I and Suffolk County scoring champion, and won the Lt. Raymond Enners Award as the Outstanding Player in Suffolk County. Upon graduation from high school in 1977, Jim attended the Naval Academy Prep School and led the lacrosse team in goals, assists and points. Jim played for Hofstra in 1979 and 1980, respectively, and led the team in assists in each of those seasons. In 1980 Jim scored 49 points in 11 games and earned Honorable Mention Division I All-America honors. The 1980 team won four of its last five games to finish with a record of 7-6. Jim scored an amazing total of 29 points in the team's last four victories, which came against Towson, Penn State, North Carolina State, and Washington and Lee.
