

## DAR Terminology

The degree audit report lists requirements that must be met for a specific degree program. Within each requirement, there may be one or more sub-requirements that must be completed before the entire requirement is satisfied. Requirement and sub-requirement symbols which may be indicated on the degree audit report are explained below.

### Requirement Symbols:

<b>NO</b>	Requirement not complete
<b>OK</b>	Requirement completed
<b>IP</b>	In-progress courses are being used to meet requirement

### Sub-requirement Symbols:

<b>+</b>	Sub-requirement complete
<b>-</b>	Sub-requirement not complete
<b>-R</b>	Required sub-requirement – (this sub-requirement must be met to complete the entire requirement (OK))
<b>*</b>	Sub-requirement has a variable number of courses or hours; some or all may be applied
<b>IP---- &gt;</b>	Reports in-progress hours in a sub-requirement

### Special Grades Used:

<b>TR</b>	Transfer, College Level Equivalency Program (CLEP), Advanced Placement credit.
<b>T -</b>	Transfer course – grade received below C-
<b>RE</b>	Course in progress
<b>P</b>	Mandatory Pass/Fail
<b>P`</b>	Optional Pass Fail
<b>P^</b>	Optional Pass Fail (New College/University Studies)

<b>SP</b>	Spring Semester
