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Hofstra Continuing Education Offers Course in the New World of Radio and TV Broadcasting

Hofstra University Continuing Education presents a glimpse into the world of broadcasting with a new course, **The New World of Radio and Television Broadcasting**.

With the introduction of new technologies over the past several years, the television and radio broadcast industry has changed dramatically. This intensive course introduces students to the new world of radio and television broadcasting. Students will learn how to assemble a newscast, including anchoring, writing, editing and reporting. The experience includes performing in front of the camera and behind the microphone, using Hofstra University's state-of-the-art equipment and facilities. The course is open to students ages 14 to adult and is taught by seasoned broadcast professionals.

Instructors include veteran broadcasters Ed Ingles (WCBS Radio), Ben Mevorach (1010 WINS Radio), Bill Korbel (News 12), Susan Murphy (assistant Dean, Hofstra University School of Communication), Mel Granick (Public Relations Director, Mercy Hospital), plus News 12 Anchor/Reporter Danielle Campbell. The course will run on Saturdays from 9 a.m. to Noon for eight weeks beginning April 18. Two of the sessions will take place at News 12 Long Island Studios.
