Weeklong Workshops for Teens and Adults

The Hofstra Sportscasting Institute, now in its ninth consecutive year, is directed by Ed Ingles, a veteran sportscaster who spent 25 years with WCBS radio and is now a professional-in-residence at Hofstra University's School of Communication. This summer's scheduled instructors include well-known sports broadcasters Len Berman, Barry Landers, Mike Breen, Marc Ernay, Joel Blumberg, C.J. Papa, John Discepolo, Ann Liguori, Ralph Benarczyk, Kenny Albert, Freddie Coleman, Tracey Wolfson, and Todd Ant, ESPN Executive John Martin, and television veteran Doug Morrow.

The Sportscasting Institute emphasizes the development of skills in television and radio reporting, anchoring, play-by-play and commentative broadcasting techniques. Through the use of in-class remote assignments, reinforced by sustained practice sessions, students are instructed in all the different facets of sports broadcasting, including talk radio and such multimedia applications as Web site sports writing and reporting. All students leave the course with their own demo CD.
