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Harold Pinter Collection, 1960-1971 bulk dates; 1967-1971 2 c.f.

Harold Pinter (1930-2008) was a playwright whose plays were on Broadway in the 1960s. In the 1950s, Pinter began to work as an actor, director and writer for the theater. In addition to theater he also used different outlets for his talents such as radio, television and film. For fifty years he was a presence in the dramatic arts. He is also known for his prose, poetry and political activism.

The collection is comprised of clippings, correspondence, theatrical programs, scripts and interviews. The items in the collection relate mostly to Harold Pinter's work as a playwright and screenwriter.

The bulk of the collection is scripts and programs for Pinter's plays that were performed in the 1960s and 1970s. A significant number of clippings from newspaper critiques and criticism are also included in the collection

Audio recordings in the collection include an interview entitled "The Pinter Puzzle" in which Alan Schneider interviews actors who were playing parts in the Broadway production of Pinter's "The Homecoming" (the actors are Ian Holm, Paul Rogers, Michael Craig). Schneider then interviews writers Lillian Hellman and Eli Wallach, who speak about Pinter's work. Schneider calls Pinter one of the most significant writers of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Schneider says Pinter "uses forces and techniques of theater to make for some kind of powerful, disturbing, shocking, electrical experience in the audience."

Another audio recording in the collection is an NBC recording of Leonard Probst interviewing Harold Pinter shortly after Pinter's play "The Tea Party" opened on Broadway. Probst asks Pinter about a recent review of the play. The review to which Probst refers was written by Walter Kerr for the November 3, 1968 *New York Times*; a copy of this review is included in the clippings section of this collection.

One audio recording contains Harold Pinter reading the poetry of other writers such as WB Yeats, ee cummings, Edna St. Vincent Millay, Ian Hamilton, John Donne, and Philip Larkin.

The original audio recordings are on reel-to-reel tapes and have been copied onto cassette tapes.
