### **Content Note**

The Weisberg Family Collection is composed of photographs, correspondence, ephemera, newspaper clippings, postcards and scrapbooks of Ruth "Shorty" Weisberg and her sister May Weisberg of Floral Park, New York, and their brother Leonard "Len" Weisberg and his wife Mildred Gordon Weisberg of Huntington Station.

### **Biographical Sketch**

The bulk of the collection contains the holdings of May Weisberg (1909-2004), a graduate of Flushing High School Class of 1928. May, who among other things worked as a Stage Manager for the American Theater Wing War Service during World War II at the legendary Stage Door Canteen in New York, kept the family scrapbooks of Leonard and Mildred's wedding in 1948, Leonard's work for MGM in the 1940s and the family's vacations spanning three decades.

Ruth Weisberg (1895-1972), the eldest of the Weisberg siblings, lived with her sister May in Floral Park and served in the American Women's Volunteer Service (AWVS) during World War II. The American Women's Voluntary Service was an organization based on a British program, called the Women's Voluntary Service (WVS), which was formed to support the armed forces and civilians on the home front. Volunteers drove ambulances, organized mobile kitchens, and sold war bonds and stamps. AWVS workshops produced over one million articles of clothing for servicemen and civilians. Members also provided meals and babysitting services to women war workers, many of whom worked six days a week in defense factories and had to manage the demands of work and home life for the first time in their lives.

Leonard Weisberg (1906-1981) worked in the entertainment trade publication industry, mainly for MGM and published a trade magazine for them called *Trade Topics* during the 1940s. His career was temporarily interrupted in 1942 when he was called to serve in the Navy during World War II. Upon returning, he resumed his career working for MGM and shortly thereafter married Mildred Gordon (1908-1997) in 1948 who was writing a column called "Broadway Wings" for the now defunct *New York Morning Telegraph*. They spent their honeymoon on the Carolinas and upon returning moved to Mildred's family "farm" in Huntington Station. After vacationing throughout Europe a few times during the 1950s, Leonard and Mildred moved to the town of Bell Lloch in northern Spain.
