Shaker Collection, c. 1850-1980. 0.4 cubic ft.

In 1747, the Wardley Society, the members of which were former Quakers, was founded in England by Jane and James Wardley. Because the society's worship services included whirling, trembling and shaking, the group became known as the "Shaking Quakers," later shortened to "Shakers." Ann Lee (1736-1784), a textile worker from Manchester, England, joined the society in 1758. After losing all four of her children at birth or in early infancy, Lee went through a period of great suffering, but later experienced a spiritual rebirth. After this experience, she became the leader of the Shakers. In 1774, after having a revelation that directed her to establish a Shaker Church (The United Society of Believers in Christ's Second Appearing) in America, she and eight followers emigrated to New York, eventually settling in Niskeyuna (later Watervliet), outside Albany.

The Shakers, who admitted members of both sexes, were a celibate sect. Their basic principles include purity of life, confession of sin, and consecration of strength, time and talent. They also dedicated themselves to the spiritual salvation of all people.

An industrious group, the Shakers are best known for their furniture making. They also created numerous inventions, including the flat broom, the circular saw and the common clothespin. In addition, they packaged and marketed seeds and were once the largest producers of medicinal herbs in the United States.

By 1800, most of the nineteen Shaker communities had been established. At their height, around 1850, there were an estimated 6,000 members living in the Northeast and in several other states. The insistence on celibacy and changes in spiritual needs led to a decline in the Shaker movement, and Sabbathday Lake in New Gloucester, Maine, is the only active remaining community. It has just two members.

The majority of the material in the collection, which spans from c. mid-19th century-1980, concerns Mt. Lebanon, which was the largest Shaker community and home to the Central Ministry. Located in New Lebanon, New York, the site is now home to a Shaker museum. There is also a small amount of material concerning Shaker communities in Maine, Massachusetts, and New Hampshire, as well as the Shaker Museum, in Old Chatham, New York.

The collection is comprised of ephemera and memorabilia, c. mid-19th century-1974; printed material and publications, 1850-1980; periodicals, articles, and news clippings, 1872-1974; and twenty-two undated black and white photographic reprints (5" x 7"), all of people and buildings in Mt. Lebanon.
