Christopher D. Morley, 1890-1957. Collection, 1918-c.1972. 1.3 cu. Ft.

Christopher Morley authored several books, poems, and essays throughout his accomplished career as a writer and editor (Nassaucountyny.gov, 2010). Born in Haverford, Pennsylvania, in 1890 (Britannica Online, 2010), he spent a portion of his life living on Long Island in his Roslyn estate (Nassaucountyny.gov, 2010). Morley also wrote in a small cabin on his property called "Knothole," which was later re-located to a Roslyn park named in his honor (Nassaucountyny.gov, 2010). He died on Long Island in March of 1957(Britannica Online, 2010). Evidence of his presence on Long Island can be found in several letters and other publications housed in the Special Collections Department.

The collection consists of numerous correspondences between Morley and rare bookseller Philip Duschnes. In addition to these correspondences, the collection contains numerous news articles by the author, as well as other ephemera relating to his work and influence on Long Island.
