Biographical Note

Marjorie Boynton Smith was born on January 27, 1894, to Samuel Raynor Smith and Ella Boynton Smith; she had one brother, Harold Wallace Smith. Raised in Freeport, New York, Marjorie attended the Packer Collegiate Institute in Brooklyn and then Smith College in Massachusetts. Her father moved to Drayton, North Dakota, in 1882, where he grew to know the Wallace family, with whom he had a familial connection. A few years later, he started the First National Bank of Drayton and worked with members of the Wallace family.

Through these connections, Marjorie met Earl Stewart Wallace, who was born in 1891 to Henry William Wallace and Charlotte Larter Wallace. He was raised in Drayton, North Dakota, along with his two sisters, Harriet and Edna, and a brother, Rex. Earl went to the University of Minnesota, where he received his Bachelor's Degree, and then attended Law School at Harvard University. Marjorie and Earl grew to know each other through letters and visits while Marjorie was at Smith College and Earl was at Harvard. In 1916, Earl and Marjorie became engaged and later that year Marjorie received her Bachelor's degree and Earl, his Law degree. Earl then moved to Minnesota to begin work as a lawyer and in early 1917 he joined the Army. On May 5, 1917, Marjorie and Earl were married in Freeport, New York, and on January 5, 1918, their first son, Henry William Wallace was born. In August of that year Earl went to France to join World War I and returned by January 1919. In that same month, his brother-in-law, Joseph Raymond Stong, died and Earl was placed in charge of his estate and became president of the First National Bank of Drayton. On March 31, 1919, Earl and Marjorie's second son, Stewart Raynor Wallace was born.

The estate became very difficult to settle and led to a great strain on Earl as he was also working as an attorney in Minneapolis. In September 1921, Earl had a nervous breakdown, which led to his leaving work. On November 1, 1921, he told Marjorie he was going to the barber shop, but never returned. His car was found by the side of the Minneapolis River, but his body was not recovered. After a lengthy search, his body was found in January of 1922 and he was believed to have committed suicide. After Earl's death, Marjorie and her sons moved back to Freeport, New York, to live with her parents. She went to Columbia Teacher's College to earn her Master's Degree and worked as a teacher on Long Island after that. During World War II, she volunteered at Mitchel Field to help the war effort, and also became very involved in researching the genealogy of her family, much of which is in this collection. Her first son, Henry William Wallace (1918-1994), became an engineer and inventor. Her second son, Stewart Raynor Wallace (1919-2009), became a geologist and was a President of the Society of Economic Geologists. Marjorie moved to Florida in the 1980s and passed away on March 14, 1992.

Samuel Raynor Smith was born on June 28, 1862, in Merrick, New York, to Carman and Ruthella Smith. He moved to Drayton, North Dakota, in 1882 and while there, he started the First National Bank of Drayton. In 1885 he married Ella Boynton and moved back to Freeport, New York, three years later. In 1893 he became the president of Far Rockaway Bank and

eventually he became the president of the Bank of Long Island and Chairman of the Executive Committee of the Bank of Manhattan. He was also an avid golfer. After the death of his wife, he married his second wife in June of 1931, Edna Wallace Stong, who was also the sister-in-law of his daughter, Marjorie Smith Wallace. Three months after their marriage, Samuel Raynor Smith died on September 28, 1931.

Scope and Content Note

This collection is composed of personal correspondence (including correspondence between Marjorie Smith Wallace and Earl Stewart Wallace from 1914-1921), letters, calling cards, photographs (including daguerreotypes, ambrotypes, tintypes, cartes de visite, cabinet cards, photographic postcards and prints), photograph albums, biographical material, personal diaries, memorabilia (silver trophies, silver plates), artifacts, fabric materials, oil paintings, collected material, and news clippings.

Notable items include a large collection of photographs including ambrotypes and daguerreotypes, letters from Nellie Russell, who was a friend of Ella Boynton Smith and a missionary in China during the Boxer Rebellion; a vast collection of genealogical research and items including a framed genealogical sampler; and locks of hair from different family members, including a chain of hair made from “great ancestors.”

The Smith/Wallace Family Collection is arranged in Thirteen Series:

- I. Correspondence – Correspondence is arranged in two sub-series: Correspondence between Marjorie Smith Wallace and Earl Stewart Wallace and General Correspondence. Correspondence is arranged chronologically within sub-series.
- II. Letters – Letters are divided into seven sub-series: General Letters to Marjorie Smith Wallace; Close Family Letters to and from Marjorie Smith Wallace; General Letters to Earl Stewart Wallace; Close Family Letters to and from Earl Stewart Wallace; General Letters to Marjorie Smith Wallace and Earl Stewart Wallace; Letters of other Smith and Wallace Family Members; Sympathy Letters for deaths of Ella Boynton Smith and Samuel Raynor Smith. Arranged chronologically within sub-series.
- III. Genealogy and Biographical Information –Arranged chronologically.
- IV. Legal Documents –Arranged in two sub-series: Earl Stewart Wallace and Other Family Members. Arranged chronologically within sub-series.
- V. Biographical Material – Arranged in 8 sub-series: Marjorie Smith Wallace; Earl Stewart Wallace; Marjorie Smith Wallace and Earl Stewart Wallace; Henry William Wallace; Samuel Raynor Smith; Ella Boynton Smith; Samuel Raynor Smith and Ella Boynton Smith; and Other Family Members.
- VI. Collected Material – Arranged chronologically.
- VII. Newspaper Clippings – Arranged chronologically.
- VIII. Books and Albums – Items include photo albums, bibles, wedding books, diaries, and a ledger.
- IX. Fabric Materials – Items include Christening dresses, lawn and lace aprons, and woolen socks.
- X. Memorabilia – Items include silver trophies and silver plates.
- XI. Artifacts – Items include fuel can, fuel funnels, stove, pencil sharpener, WWI pins, and Red Cross uniform pins.

XI. Photographs – Items include tintypes, daguerreotypes, ambrotypes, cabinet cards, cartes de visite, photographic postcards, and prints. Housed in different sized envelopes, envelope size is noted in each section. Prints are divided into sections of Close Family Members; Other Family Members and General Photographs; and Frutchey Family Photos. Prints are black and white unless otherwise indicated.

XIII. Paintings and Drawings

Key Individuals Represented within the Collection

Boynton Family

Boynton, Reverend Charles F. (1832-1908) was the son of Samuel and Charlotte Freeman (1800-1898) of Portland, Maine. He had seven siblings: Charlotte Freeman Boynton (1829-1896), John Alden Boynton (1831-1835), George Freeman Boynton (b. 1836), William Ladd Boynton (1840-1841), Elizabeth (Lib) Boynton (b. 1834-alive as of 1925), Henry Holmes Boynton (1839-1859), and Edward Boynton (b. 1844).

Boynton, Ellen Lavinia Loring (1843-1903) was the daughter of Asa Tewksbury Loring (1813-1880) and Lavinia Webster Loring (1819-1944). They lived in Maine. Her mother died in 1844 and her father married Adelia Louisa Patten (1824-1889) in 1845. She had five siblings: James Tewksbury Loring (1847-1864, died in the Civil War), Emma August Loring Bremner (b.1848), George Edwin Loring (b. 1852), Charles Henry Loring, and Sarah Maria Loring (b. 1859).

Smith Family

Smith, Ella Boynton (1863-1930) was the daughter of Reverend Charles F. Boynton and Ellen Lavinia Loring Boynton. She was originally from Maine and had seven siblings: Charles Edward Boynton (1865-1936), John Loring Boynton (1867-1874), Mary Louise Boynton Johnson (1870-1955), Anne Boynton Frutchey (1873-1968), Charlotte Lavinia Boynton (1879-1893), George Ilsley Boynton (b. 1881), and Sarah (Sadie) Boynton Carnie (1887-1967). She married Samuel Raynor Smith in 1885 and they lived in Freeport, New York. She had three children, Harold Wallace Smith and Hugh Boynton Smith (twins; Hugh Boynton Smith died at the age of 1) and Marjorie Smith Wallace. She is also referred to as Ellen Elizabeth Boynton or Ella Boynton.

Smith, Harold Wallace (b. 1887) was the son of Samuel Raynor Smith and Ella Boynton Smith. He married Elizabeth (Elsie) Vogel in 1913 and they had a daughter, Elizabeth Frehmeyer Vogel (d. 18 months), and a son, Louis Henry Vogel Smith.

Smith, Samuel Raynor (1862-1931) was the son of Carman and Ruthella Smith. He was born in Merrick, New York. He married Ella Boynton in 1885. They had three children Harold Wallace Smith and Hugh Boynton Smith (twins; Hugh Boynton Smith died at the age of 1) and Marjorie

Smith Wallace. Ella Boynton Smith died in 1930 and in June 1931, Samuel married Edna Wallace Stong, the sister-in-law of his daughter, Marjorie.

Wallace, Marjorie Smith (1894-1992) was the daughter of Samuel Raynor Smith and Ella Boynton Smith of Freeport, New York. She married Earl Stewart Wallace from 1917 until his death in 1921. They had two sons, Henry William Wallace and Stewart Raynor Wallace. She is also referred to as Marjorie B. Smith or Marjorie Boynton Smith.

Wallace Family

Hanson, Harriet Wallace (1884-1969) was the daughter of Henry William Wallace and Charlotte Larter Wallace and the sister of Earl Stewart Wallace and Edna Wallace Stong. She married Victor Hanson and had three children, Charlotte, Joan, and Wallace. They lived in Minneapolis. Her family called her by the nickname "Hat." Also referred to as Harriet Wallace.

Wallace, Charlotte Larter (1860-1924) was the mother of Earl Stewart Wallace, Harriet Wallace Hanson, Edna Wallace Stong, and Rex Wallace (d. 1912). Her husband was Henry William Wallace who died in 1912. They lived in Drayton, North Dakota.

Wallace, Earl Stewart (1891-1921) was the son of Henry William Wallace and Charlotte Larter Wallace. He was raised in Drayton, North Dakota, and had two sisters, Harriet and Edna Wallace, and one brother, Rex Wallace.

Stong, Edna Wallace (1883-1965) was the daughter of Henry William Wallace and Charlotte Larter Wallace and the sister of Earl Stewart Wallace and Harriet Wallace Hanson. She was married to Joseph Raymond Stong (known as Ray) until his death in 1919. She had two children, Elizabeth (Betty) Stong and Raymond Stong. In 1931, she married Samuel Raynor Smith, who died a few months later. Her family called her by the nickname "Ted." Also referred to as Edna Wallace and Edna Wallace Stong Smith.

Wallace, Henry William (1918-1994) was the son of Marjorie Smith Wallace and Earl Stewart Wallace. He had three children, Wanda, Cynthia Ann, and Victoria.

Wallace, Stewart Raynor (1919-2009) was the son of Marjorie Smith Wallace and Earl Stewart Wallace. He had two children, William Dodge Wallace and Margaret Boynton Wallace.
