Pervasive Developmental Disorders: Fast Facts

We thought it would be a great idea to highlight the understanding of a particular disability in this section of each new issue. We will inaugurate our new activity with disabilities on the Autism Spectrum.

Students with Asperger's or Autism may have difficulty approaching you for help because it is often difficult for these individuals to communicate with those around them

- They may feel uncomfortable in situations that are new for them.
- These students may be easily distracted or made uncomfortable by loud, abrupt noises or bright lights.

- Calling on students with Asperger's or Autism in class may not be the best way to engage them. Often, these individuals listen and absorb information quietly.
- With patience and by giving these students some time to adjust, it may be easier for them to approach you. Remember, if you have a concern, we are just a call away!
