<i>Colleges and Schools</i>	Hofstra College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Frank G. Zarb School of Business, School of Communication, School of Education and Allied Human Services, New College of Hofstra (innovative undergraduate college), School of Law, School for University Studies, Honors College, Saturday College and University College for Continuing Education.
<i>Faculty</i>	There are 1,325 faculty members of whom 524 are full time; 90 percent of full-time faculty hold the highest degrees in their fields.
<i>Student Body</i>	Full-time undergraduate enrollment of 8,369. Total University enrollment including part-time undergraduate, graduate and School of Law is about 13,300. Average undergraduate class size is 22 students; student faculty ratio is 14:1; male-female ratio is approximately 43-57.
<i>Undergraduate Degrees</i>	Bachelor of Arts in fields of specialization in the humanities, fine arts, communications, education, natural sciences, mathematics, computer science, engineering and social sciences, etc., with courses offered to provide a pre-professional and professional background in law, medicine, health, education, etc.; Bachelor of Fine Arts with specialization in theater arts; Bachelor of Business Administration with specializations in accounting, finance, international business, entrepreneurship, computer information systems, management, marketing, etc.; Bachelor of Engineering with specializations in engineering sciences; Bachelor of Science in scientific-technical programs and programs in business economics, fine arts, mathematics, computers, music, communications, athletic training, exercise specialist, physician assistant, etc.; Bachelor of Science in Education, in specializations in fine arts, music, physical education. 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Graduate Degrees

Doctor of Philosophy in Clinical and School Psychology, Applied Organizational Psychology, and Reading Language and Cognition; Doctor of Education in Educational and Policy Leadership, and in Reading, Language, and Cognition; Doctor of Psychology in School-Community Psychology; Juris Doctor, Master of Laws in International Law and American Legal Studies; Professional and Advanced Study Diplomas and Certificates; Master of Arts in areas such as the humanities, social sciences, applied and natural sciences, education, psychology, mathematics, communication, music, health administration, etc.; Master of Business Administration, with specializations in accounting, marketing, management, taxation, finance, etc. plus a Juris Doctor/MBA degree program; Executive Master of Business Administration Program; Master of Science with programs in business, computer science, natural sciences, mathematics, marketing research, education, community health, engineering management, human resource management, etc.; Master of Science in Education with specializations in English, mathematics, sciences, foreign languages, business, administration, literacy studies, music, fine arts, counseling, special education, etc.; Postdoctoral re-specialization in Clinical and/or School Psychology. Concentrations and co-majors are offered under many of the degree programs.

Academic Level of Undergraduate Student Body

Hofstra is a selective institution seeking to enroll those students who demonstrate the academic ability, intellectual curiosity, and motivation to succeed, and contribute to the campus community. Hofstra enrolled over 2,600 new students of whom 1,877 are first-time undergraduates in 2003-2004.

The Campus

A recognized member of the American Association of Botanical Gardens and Arboreta with 113 buildings on 240 acres. Thirty-seven residence halls accommodate approximately 4,200 students. Hofstra is 100 percent program accessible to persons with disabilities.
