- a. Brittany Rhoden Visits Senate!
  - i. Director of Student Wellness and Education and Title IX coordinator. I handle all reports that relate to student issues, such as students against students, students against family, students against faculty, etc. I am a support and intermeasures personal. I do housing accommodations, Title IX training based upon your position, also train any staff who could get a Title IX report, hold different programs and events surrounding Title IX, that is only a small snapshot of what I do!
    - 1. Chair Jackson: What brought you into this line of work?
      - a. I get this question a lot. For me, statistically folks who experience these Title IX incidents end with students leaving school as they do not know where to go. My passion is helping students staying and finding a good place to talk
    - 2. Senator Katz: What are the policies surrounding Title IX training?
      - a. We have programs that surround the different types of violence that falls under Title IX, consent issues, who is a part of the process in administration, who is involved in the

process of an active investigation, the trainings show mandated reporters have to pounds

3. Senator Schmidt: If someone comes to you personally with a Title IX, what should we say?
  - a. They can go to Public Safety and report if it is past my office's hours but I would always encourage them to come to me as I can guide them through the process.
4. Chair Staderker: One of my associates asked, what is the communication between your office and Public Safety?
  - a. So when it comes to myself and Public safety, when we get incoming reports, I talk to Nathalie Johnson (she heads the investigations). We meet weekly to talk about these cases and how they are being handled. For us, we have a set routine. All of them get specific training for handling Title IX events
5. Senator Tauro: You said Public Safety undergoes training, what other positions go through these training?
  - a. All Hofstra employees receive Harassment training. I personally train RDs, incoming professors, and other officers.
6. Senator Siegel: Is there a particular reason staff don't get Title IX training?
  - a. Depending on when new faculty come in, they may miss it but they do have refreshers.
7. Comptroller Fountain: Could you elaborate on the policies surrounding when students come to your office with Title IX concerns and want to keep it confidential?
  - a. If a student wants to speak to someone completely confidential, it would need to be a religious leader (clergy), a doctor at SHS, or counseling. Anyone else would have to report it to me.
8. Senator Wallace: What kind of sensitivity training receive inside and outside the office for treating students with respect?
  - a. I teach these in my training to keep in mind different cultures, and different aspects of the students. I teach them how to talk to students.
9. Chair Staderker: Sexual Assault Awareness month is April, what kind of programming have you done?

- a. We have done Take back the Night rallies, workshops, tabling, and are willing to add more based on students feedback.
- 10. Senator Siegel: We have Ethicspoint as a reporting system, is there any way students can feel safe knowing it is only going to you?
  - a. If you use specifically the Title IX link, it will come right to me
- 11. Senator Tauro: How does reporting anonymously work through Ethicspoint and Title IX?
  - a. On the Title IX link you can report anonymous or with a name. However if you are doing this anonymously please add as many details as possible so I can do outreach.
- 12. Chair Jackson: How can we as SGA support you?
  - a. I am always down to do programs together, such as an awareness week for any ideas you have. Please reach out so we can work together. Encourage students to come out and be there. For training, I have turnouts, for programming not so much right now but I am working on it!
- 13. Senator Katz: You talked about training for professors, if there is a triggering topic covered in class, can they be excused from class without being penalized?
  - a. I think that is appropriate and I would advocate for them on the students behalf. We would work something out.
- 14. Senator Papasadero: Could there be a statement in courses that it would be okay to be excused if something triggering is shown?
  - a. I could bring up that ask but I can not make that determination. It is always offered when a student meets with me but there could be students that do not feel comfortable coming to me and also fall into this as a blanket syllabus change.
- 15. Vice President Singh: Are the numbers on the Public Safety end of year reports for dating violence what you also see
  - a. All of those reports are collaborative and the numbers are mostly the same
- 16. Secretary Campbell: Worked previously as academic affairs chair, I recommended just showing your face to students as much as possible in different facets outside of Title IX. Health & Wellness Club Recognition
  - b. Health and Wellness Club Recognition

- i. Any major can join and we want to provide a space to get involved at Hofstra. Provide a sense of community for all of our members. Hold meetings in person and on Zoom, typically around 15-18 members, previous events are Breast cancer awareness, bake sales, fundraisers, painting events, and a lot of collaboration. Our budget is subject to change but it is about 250-300 each month, we are looking to hold and sponsor events. Art distresses events and fundraising. Being SGA-recognized, will help with the money needed, and reach a larger group of people at Hofstra, and we would be able to reach more of the student body.

**B. New Business**

- a. Joe Barwill & Dom Lavin Visits Senate!
  - i. Joe Barkwill is Vp and Dom Lavin is in charge of campus operations! We do all the new construction, maintenance, grounds, public safety and the list goes on! Anything that is non-academic. Some of the things that are going on include the new building (which is scheduled to be completed in June for opening in September, it is both the engineering and nursing building), the new lot, Hagerdorn is being renovated to build labs for a new PT program, November 11th Basketball game, we renovated the patio for Bits, we have the interfaith and the back of bits on our radar as well, 30 clocks have been purchased and need homes, ADA panels, elevators are being looked at, and we have the master plan of the student. This plan has had a lot of conversations about this. We are looking to renovate our towers, our quads, opening more seating areas, if there are any areas on campus that you would like to see outdoor seating please reach out! The library had contractors in it today and we are planning on working on the outside and the windows! Walter is back!
    - 1. Senator Siegel: What will be replacing the turnstiles? And I know you are currently in charge of the contract of dining, I know the university gives money to make the kosher food items comparable to what they would be in an outside environment? What is the policy for the heaters specifically for the towers?
      - a. We are looking to change the hours of the RSR and update the ID cards and card readers. We are pushing a digital wallet on campus which can convert a lot of different things around campus, looking at it also from a dining perspective and access to dorms. Card access during the day, and RSR in the evening- and that just wouldn't work if we keep the turnstile. We do some different pricing for Kosher but it is based upon the labor involved but unsure of anything other than that. This question about the heating and cooling system comes up every year- we have different systems for every residence hall. There is not a requirement to provide cool air, and we do, but it is required to provide

heating. We look at the weather and switch them to heat to what we think is best overall, and sometimes we have hotter days, but updating these units to the ones like in colonial square is not particularly a cheap endeavor or easy construction. It's a big nut to crack. We do still adjust the settings when it gets really hot, but overall it's a tricky switch. It is not something for the near future.

2. Senator Egolf: I'm not sure if you are aware, but the ADA door at the entrance of Colonial Square West sometimes malfunctions. The buttons do work at times, and sometimes they don't.
  - a. I want to start testing them every two weeks for this reason. All of our newer buildings are LEAD certified but they have time delays to prevent hot or cold air. They are open for 10 seconds. The first door opens but then the second door does not but we have now taken away the delay. We would have to look at all of these factors. We are finding that some panels and delays are what we need to check. We are also asking our custodial and public safety staff to test them during their morning/nightly checks.
3. Chair Anniballi: It seems like it has been a priority to create the new buildings, but the other buildings are lacking in improvements. Do we have plans for renovations and improvements to these older buildings?
  - a. You are right on all fronts. I have been here for many years, and I have helped put up all the new buildings around campus. We have a new Provost, and we are currently looking and giving a list of classrooms that need to have priority in renovating. We are working on a grant in order to receive money to update our classrooms- it's expensive. What are we planning? We want all new flooring, universal design on the furniture, new ceilings and lighting- all of which will give faculty flexibility on setting up their classrooms. We also have to work with the registrar to make sure we can still have enough seating within the classrooms with this new universal design. We are focusing on some of these older buildings. We are having a faculty committee to also discuss technology within the classrooms, and we want their input on the design of the classrooms.

4. Chair Atlas: I have noticed in the men's rooms of CV Starr, the water in the sink is very hot, almost scalding. I was wondering if there was a way to collaborate or fix this?
  - a. There are different ways to control the sink temperature. I will have the plumbers take a look and see what we can do for both buildings.
5. Chair Pandit: I had thought the space between library and the buildings would be a nice area to place chairs or an outside space for students. A lot of club sports have reached out about putting in solar panel lights on the fields.
  - a. Sure, like Dom said we do have some money that we want to put towards these areas. We have to do the exterior of the library first, but we are looking to do something with the lower levels and make a new seating area. I'd have to look into that kind of lighting. You may just not get the level of light you would need anyway to light up a field, but we can for sure take a look. We have had conversations about this, maybe about another turf field or a track added to campus- there's not really a time frame for this but all under the same idea.
6. Chair Boothe: I was wondering if you would be able to talk about renewable energy credits. Part of the master plan has a key focus on sustainability, will students be able to partake and participate in this implementation? I know all new buildings are LEED certified, I was hoping to know what the green roof is going to look/be like? Are there any plans to add more sensory promoting plants in there?
  - a. Dom Lavin: So I spoke to Joe about this. He works with the energy credits.
  - b. Joe: We pay a certain charge to get this premium. It helps subsidize the energy generated on a grid and invest in it. It's something called a REC. We pay money so that we can invest in a certain infrastructure, and we get credit for that. Jess and I will be leading the sustainability effort. We have to see from an environmental setting, but for example LED lighting is very energy efficient and saves us money and consumption. Anywhere we do renovations, we add LED lighting. There will be two green roofs for the new building- there is kind of a lower level to the building towards the south which will be open to students. The main roof will technically be open to everyone, but you have to

go through the Dean's office so it may not be as readily accessible. We don't want smoking in these areas, and this has been a big concern for us and we want to stay very mindful of this. We will make it a nice area, with lots of seating areas. Hopefully the area between the two buildings will also be a nice patio/plaza area.

- c. Dom Lavin: Regarding the Sensory Garden, we replaced the wooden aspects of the area to make sure the area can sustain the weather. We are open for suggestions of what you want to see! Our grounds director is retiring next week, so we have a whole new group reimagining these ideas.
- 7. Senator Egolf: The handle to the CV Starr 2nd floor women's bathroom turns upwards to open. I also like the 2nd floor of the library and making the basement like this, I think many students would like this.
  - a. We will check it out. It must have been installed incorrectly. We are looking at plans together. The library needs to be relooked at as students today use the library much differently now then what it used to be utilized for. We want to find a new purpose for the library. We want to find better ways to utilize the space.
- 8. Chair Anniballi: I like the idea of turning one of the other stacks space into a study space. I know a lot of students use the 10th floor or one of the higher up floors.
  - a. I am praying for a good price but the 10th floor will be entirely re-done. We are looking to fix traffic jams and things like that. We need to work with library staff with this as well.
- b. The Pride Network Club Recognition
  - i. The Pride Network is the largest LGBTQ+ organizations and due to the pandemic we became inactive. We want to provide a safe space for people at Hofstra as well as education for not only our members but also allies. We are hoping to put on movie nights, make Hofstra's community a safe and warm presence, and we also want to do community outreach as well. Our meetings have been Bimonthly and are both informational and educational. We have been pairing with other organizations for event planning and more events to be held. Recognition would give us access to funding and this would be used not only for education, events, and even merch or giveaways to be utilized for events.

1. Chair Jackson: I am the chair of Equity and Inclusion, I would love to be roped in for the Drag Show!
  - a. We will be having meetings coming and we will loop you in!
2. Senator Siegel: How many people do you have in your club and how many come to meetings on average?
  - a. Tracking membership is kind of hard but our email list has 200 members and about 40-50 have come in total. About 15-20 people on average attend each meeting.
- ii. Comptroller Fountain: What are the graduate students doing in the capacity of this club?
  1. The meetings are open for people to pop in even if they are graduate students.
- iii. Chair Anniballi: Keep in mind that if the graduate students are benefiting from the undergraduate student activity fee, that is something not that we would like to promote.

  - i. Senator Tauro: So regarding the suggestions throughout the committee meetings, would we change those in the caucus.
    1. Vice President Signh: No this would not happen, it would happen after the caucus
  - ii. Comptroller Fountain moves for a 5 minutes caucus
    1. Motion seconded

  - iii. Comptroller Fountain: This came after my meeting with Sev today and I am hoping to do a resolution next semester to get SGA compensated and with this I may add a question but this will need to have a question struck as well. I want to collect this data not only for us but other ideas as well. I was thinking of striking the clock question as it has been moved on with

by the appropriate people. I don't believe we may need more data about clocks.

1. Senator Egolf: I think there are mixed opinions on SGA compensation and I think it should be a joint conversation with other leaders but not the entire population of the school. I think this should be a step system in a way, and should be discussed further amongst our group as well as our Student Leaders who would be a part of this initiative.
2. Chair Atlas: To reference a previous speaker, I think there should be a concrete discussion on the compensation. I do what to point out that the clock question
3. Chair Atlas moves for a straw poll regarding if we were to remove a question, would you be in favor of cutting the clock question?
  - a. Motion seconded
  - b. Motion passed
    - i. Senator Tauro: You referenced that Joe is working on this with the clocks, what is the context?
    - ii. Chair Atlas: As of today, 30 clocks have been have been purchased and are going to be distributed throughout classrooms on campus
      1. Chair Jackson moves to extend time by 5 minutes
        - a. Motion seconded
        - b. Motion passed
    - iii. The straw poll results in a majority in favor of striking the clock question.
4. Comptroller Fountain: I would like to point out that Sev is in favor of doing this because we will have to collect this data
  - a. Senator Greenlaw: I think it would be better to gauge internal opinion before student body
  - b. Chair Jackson: I do believe the compensation point is a needed point but I do not want the senators to feel blindsided by a decision. We could do separate surveys.
  - c. Chair Boothe: I also agree with previous speakers and I believe it should be talked about internally before it goes externally. I do know you have a student activity fee question and I believe that this would be more appropriate to put in at this point

- d. Chair Giovannangelo: I think there should be more cohesiveness within SGA and I believe that this should be done before we move forward.
- e. Senator Tauro: As a senator, I do feel out of the loop and I do believe that we should also be able to be a part of this conversation. As for question 9, I believe the data is still important
- f. Chair Anniballi: I believe there is a happy middle, with asking about the student activity, “Would you support an increase in the student activity fee to fund student engagement?”. Something like this could be a good middle ground with this.
  - i. Senator Papasedero moves to extend speaking time by 5 minutes
    - 1. Motion seconded

- g. Chair Jackson: I believe it would be a good question to ask, but I do know it is comptroller Fountain’s time table
  - i. Comptroller Fountain: I understand the feelings of being out of the loop but we are very much at the beginning of this resolution. I want this student to be more in general as RHA, SGA, do not have compensation but also RAs who need more compensation. There are multiple resolutions coming.
    - 1. Senator Seigel: I don't want to pay anymore money.
- h. Chair DeCrescenzo: It is unfair to assume everyone knows about this but I think we should make that clear
- i. Chair Stadeker: I think it would be more valuable to have a Public safety question.
- j. Senator Egolf: I think we should need a lot more discussion about this but I believe the things regarding financials can be a separate survey.
  - i. Senator Egolf moves to open a 10 minute moderated caucus
    - 1. Motion seconded
    - 2. Motion passed



- k. Senator Tauro: I think the lack of knowledge of the student activity fee is there and I think there should be more conversations about this.
  - i. Chair Stacker: I did want to add a question about Public safety and if students feel safe talking to them.
- l. Chair Pandit: All questions should be for the entire student body
- m. Chair Anniballi: I agree with a previous speaker.
- n. Senator Livingston: This needs to be a conversation of compensation but I do believe that this information can be used in multiple places now or later.
