SPORTS JOURNALISM: A RAPIDLY GROWING FIELD

The world of sports journalism has been rapidly evolving over the last few years. With continuous technological advancements, opportunities for sports journalists are limited only by the imagination. Sports journalists now have more options to make their voices heard, and with the growth of online radio and television broadcasting, social media, and blogs, their voices can reach sports fans across the globe.

IT'S NEVER TOO EARLY TO START

Hofstra University Continuing Education has offered sports journalism courses for more than 15 years, and many of our students have gone on to become successful sportscasters and sports journalists. For teens who are passionate about sports and sportscasting, Hofstra's sports journalism classes will give them the skills they need to gain a competitive edge.

LEARN SKILLS FROM WORKING PROFESSIONALS

Our instructors are all professionals working as sports journalists and broadcasters. They teach students important skills such as writing, on-air presence, voice control, camera and audio setup, editing, and working as part of a team. The goals of these courses are to help students grow as people and to act as stepping stones to a professional life in sports journalism. Throughout the courses, instructors provide constructive critiques and honest student assessments. Students begin networking with professionals and get tips for the next step — whether it's preparation for college or a job.

Training includes the following:

- Vocal coaching
- Sports research
- Writing television and radio scripts
- Sports writing and blogging
- Interviewing techniques
- Memorization tips
- Teleprompter use

- Play-by-play and color commentary
- Television sports anchoring
- Pre- and postgame preparation and hosting
- Television and radio studio operations

- Talk show hosting
- Networking

Students leave these workshops feeling more confident about their communication skills and with a better understanding of what they need to do to reach their goals.

SPORTS JOURNALISM CERTIFICATE PROGRAM FOR TEENS

Hofstra University Continuing Education offers a precollegiate, noncredit Sports Journalism Certificate Program for students 12 to 18 years of age. The series of courses within the certificate program provides participants with the core foundation and skill sets required to succeed in sports journalism today. All sports journalism courses can also be taken as individual classes without being part of the certificate program.

The Sports Journalism Certificate Program requires successful completion of six (6) required courses and two (2) elective courses.

Required Courses:

- Introduction to Sportscasting for Teens OR Introduction to Sports Journalism for Young Women
- Sportscasting Research and Prep
- Sports Writing, Blogging, and Social Media
- Preparing and Conducting Sports-Related Interviews
- Sports Radio Hosting
- Sports Producing and Editing

Elective Courses (choose two):

- Intermediate Sportscasting for Teens
- Vocal Coaching
- Sports Television Hosting and Anchoring
- Television Sports Reporting
- Hosting Pre- and Postgame Shows for Radio and Television
- Sports Roundtable Hosting
- Sports Play-by-Play for Television and Radio
- Sports Fantasy Preparation, Drafting, and Debating
- Sports Journalism 101 for Teens

The concentration of skill sets taught in this certificate program helps prepare students for college-level studies, work experiences at the collegiate level, and future goals.

Upon successful completion of the required courses and electives, students receive a Hofstra University Continuing Education official transcript and a program certificate. The certificate can be earned in less than one year.
