# SPECIALTY CAMPS

Please choose camp programs based on the grade your child will enter in September 2024.

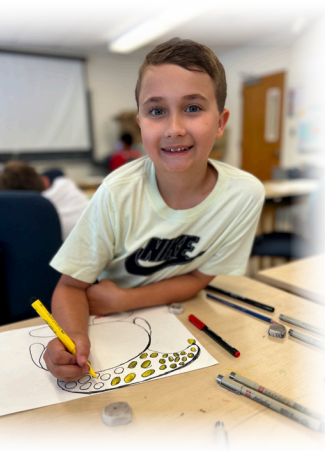
## Adventure Education

Grades 2-10 (Sessions 1, 2, 3)

- This camp is modeled after the popular Project Adventure and Outward Bound programs.
- Campers learn personal and social responsibility, trust, effective communication, problem-solving, and teamwork, and how to face mental, physical, and emotional challenges.

## Basketball - Grades 2-10 (Sessions 1, 2, 3)

- Campers learn foundational drills that help them with dribbling, shooting, and passing, along with offensive and defensive techniques in this **half-day program**.
- This coed program emphasizes sportsmanship and teamwork.



## Cartoon Workshop - Grades 6-10 (Session 3)

- This workshop allows both experienced and new cartoonists to learn the process from creation to publication.
- Campers create their own characters, write and draw their own stories, and create color comics for the web and a class comic book.



## Flag Football - Grades 2-10 (Session 3)

- Campers use noncontact drills, games, and scrimmages to improve their skills and knowledge of the game.
- Coaches emphasize sportsmanship, teamwork, and fair play.



## Hofstra Art Experience - Grades 2-10 (Sessions 1, 2)

- Campers learn age-specific art techniques, styles, and mediums through individual and small-group instruction.
- Curriculum areas include modeling clay, Beyond the Rainbow painting, and cartooning.



## Marine Biology - Grades 2-10 (Session 2)

- Campers create and maintain a saltwater aquarium and learn about various marine environments.
- We explore various marine organisms such as algae, seaweeds, cnidarians, mollusks, porifera, echinoderms, osteichthyes, chondrichthyes, and cetaceans.

## Mural Making: Design, Create, Paint!

### Grades 2-5 (Session 3)

- Campers learn the basics of creating large-format artwork and how to plan, design, and execute materials using a variety of mediums.
- Projects vary in approach, from spontaneous drawing to fully realized murals on paper or board using different materials.

## Reading/Writing Learning Clinic – Grades 2-10 (Sessions 1, 2, 3)

- Campers improve their confidence and interest in reading and writing as they prepare for the challenges of the new school year.
- Classes are taught by New York state-certified literacy specialists at Hofstra's Joan and Arnold Saltzman Community Services Center.



## Science Discovery Lab

### Grades 2-10 (Session 1)

- Biology, chemistry, physics, rocketry, nutrition, and aerospace are covered.
- Campers enjoy using Hofstra University's state-of-the-art science labs for many different hands-on experiments.



## Sports Sampler – Grades 2-10 (Session 1)

- Not sure which sport your camper prefers? Here is their chance to try out different sports and see which one they like best!
- Campers learn and practice the basics of basketball, soccer, tennis, and adventure education.



## STEM Workshop – Grades 2-5 (Session 1) • Grades 2-10 (Session 3)

- Campers learn various life skills through problem-solving, resourcefulness, and creativity.
- We use hands-on learning to combine education and fun with an emphasis on achievement and growth.

## Tennis – Grades 2-10 (Sessions 1, 2)

- This program accommodates players of all levels; campers are evaluated on the first day and placed in groups according to their ability.
- Scoring, strokes, and strategies are taught in a fun and supportive environment.

# GAME BUILDERS ACADEMY

Hofstra is proud to partner with **Game Builders Academy (GBA)** to offer programs designed to get campers excited about math, science, and technology. Any program listed in this section is eligible for the Makerspace Experience add-on.

## **Artificial Intelligence Revolution** - Grades 2-10 (Session 1) **NEW FOR 2024!**

- Using cutting-edge Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools and technologies, campers experiment and innovate across the fields of coding, art, audio, writing, production, and more.
- Campers gain hands-on experience while learning the inner workings of machine learning and the various ways they can utilize it.

## **Esports Gaming and Technology**

Grades 6-10 (Sessions 1, 2, 3)

- Campers compete and hone their skills in a wide variety of the most popular esports video games – including Super Smash Bros., Fortnite, and League of Legends – culminating in a livestreamed Twitch.tv at the end of each session.
- They learn cutting-edge video editing skills, design, as well as code their own competitive game, while using industry capture cards, headphones, monitors, and controllers.



## **Fashion Design Runway** - Grades 4-10 (Sessions 1, 2, 3)

- Campers design their own line of clothing and accessories, using both traditional sewing machines and couture, as well as 3D printing and CAD technology.
- Campers gain insight into the fast-growing fashion industry.

## **Fortnite/Unreal Engine Game Design** - Grades 6-10 (Session 3)

**NEW FOR 2024!**

- Campers create their own original Fortnite maps and environments using the same professional Unreal Engine software used to create this popular game.
- They will strengthen their analytical, artistic, computer science, design (3D), and communication skills while playtesting their Fortnite worlds with their friends.



## **JavaScript Web Design** - Grades 6-10 (Session 2)

- Campers construct their own websites using HTML, JavaScript, and CSS coding.
- They use Google Analytics and search engine optimization to track visitors and improve traffic to their websites.

## **Minecraft Builders Club** - Grades 2-5 (Sessions 1, 3)

- Campers use Minecraft tools and systems to create and play together.
- Using math and science, campers take part in building challenges, create team living spaces, and collaborate on projects.

## Minecraft Modding Lab - Grades 6-10 (Sessions 1, 3)

- Using the new Datapack modding system, campers create their own Minecraft mods – complete with custom mobs, blocks, items, texture packs, game rules, and more!
- Campers build upon their coding skills to create 3D models and pixel art as they delve further into one of the bestselling video games.

## Pokémon Master Makers - Grades 2-5 (Sessions 2, 3)

- Campers share their excitement for the world of Pokémon while taking part in daily hands-on projects revolving around the fantastic environment.
- Pokémon campers have the opportunity to work with state-of-the-art technology, including a 3D printer, photo editing software, and game design software.

## Roblox Game Design

Grades 2-5 (Session 1) • Grades 2-10 (Sessions 2, 3)

- Using Roblox Studio and the LUA coding platform, campers create fantastic worlds and games within the Roblox universe.
- Roblox fans put their own unique spin on the game in this engaging camp!

## Robotics - Grades 2-10 (Sessions 1, 2, 3)

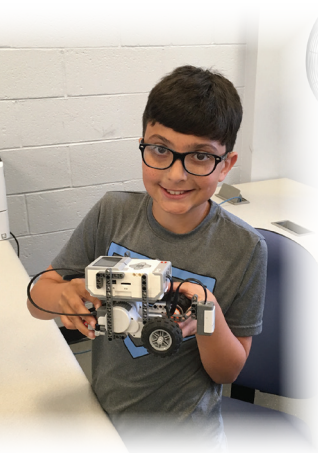
- Campers learn the fundamentals of robot engineering to program their robot to move, spin, throw, react, and compete against fellow campers.
- We use cutting-edge software, including the Lego Mindstorms EV3 and Sphero robotic kits.

## RPG Game Design - Grades 6-10 (Session 2)

- Using the popular RPG Maker MV engine, campers create role-playing video games.
- While analyzing the rich stories of games like Undertale and the Final Fantasy series, campers create games with sprawling maps and tile sets, story-driven characters with dialogue, sophisticated battle systems, and event-based coding.

## 3D Printing and Animation - Grades 2-10 (Sessions 1, 2, 3)

- Campers create their own 3D art, including 3D characters, environments, and animations – no prior drawing or art experience is required.
- Participants use Maxon's Cinema 4D – the same software used by professionals to create many of today's animated films.

## Video Game Design 101 - Grades 2-5 (Sessions 1, 2, 3)

- Campers learn the foundations of video game design in a fun and supportive environment.

## Virtual Reality/Augmented Reality Creation Zone

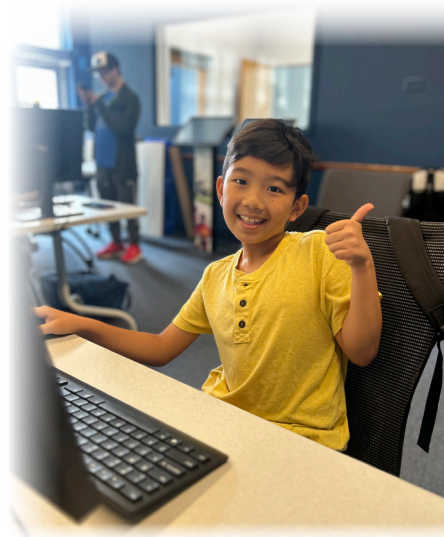
Grades 2-10 (Session 2) **NEW FOR 2024!**

- Campers paint wondrous works of art within a captivating virtual 3D space, which must truly be seen to be believed.
- Participants work with industry-leading tools and mediums, such as Adobe Photoshop, Google Tilt Brush, Paint 3D, Wacom drawing tablets, Tinkercad, and pixel/voxel art.

## Virtual Reality/Unity Game Design

Grades 6-10 (Session 1)

- Campers code their own 3D game using the powerful C# language supported by Unity – the same software used to make Cuphead and Pokémon Go.
- While developing these games, campers learn to utilize the revolutionary virtual reality (VR) and augmented reality (AR) features, and test their games using Oculus Rift systems and other cutting-edge technology.



## YouTube Video Production

Grades 6-10 (Sessions 1, 3)

- Campers go from being YouTube viewers to YouTube creators by using tools like Adobe Premiere, OBS Studio, Audacity, and a wide array of cameras and microphones.
- Participants explore the skills needed for video capture, recording, editing, streaming, special effects, and audio production.

## GBA Makerspace Experience\* - Grades 6-10 (Sessions 1, 2, 3)

Campers in Grades 6-10 registered for any GBA program have the option to participate in this **add-on** in place of recreation and instructional swim. A \$450 surcharge per session applies.



# SESSION 4 CAMPS

## Aquatics - Grades 4-10

- Aquatic activities may include diving/swim instruction, personal water safety, water basketball, water polo, relays, team sports, and lots of fun and games.

This *six-week program* prepares campers for all aspects involved in being a counselor, which will open up an opportunity to apply for a position at Hofstra Summer Camps. This comprehensive camp teaches all about building relationships and understanding and implementing policies and procedures. Campers receive training in CPR, bullying prevention, and understanding the needs of all members of our camp population. Camp counselors have the ability to help others grow and learn while having a lot of fun.

## Cub Camp - Grades K-1 (Sessions 1, 2, 3, 4)

For campers who are entering kindergarten or first grade, the camp experience is brand new. Cub Camp provides these youngsters with the opportunity to enjoy a wide range of activities that will enhance their physical, mental, emotional, and social development to get them ready for the next school year.

## Elite Tennis - Grades 6-10 (Sessions 1, 2)

Campers participate in supervised practice and competition in the morning, while the afternoon consists of learning new skills and strategies, as well as drills specific to the game. **Campers must be interviewed by the program directors prior to registering.**

## Gifted Camp - Grades K-7 (Sessions 1, 2, 3)

Hofstra Gifted Camp is designed to meet the educational needs of the high-achieving camper. Campers participate in three 60-minute classes per day. Two classes are taught in the morning, and one class is taught after lunch, followed by a 45-minute recreational period. Instruction includes humanities, foreign language, science, and mathematics. **See our website for admission criteria.**

## REACH - Grades K-10 (Sessions 1, 2, 3, 4)

This exciting support program is a great opportunity for campers with autism spectrum disorders or special needs to experience Hofstra Summer Camps with peers. The REACH program provides a safe and positive setting for campers with disabilities to receive support and/or modifications in their chosen specialty or Learning Institute program (not applicable to Sports Academy Camps). This program is the perfect setting for ongoing interventions during the summer break. **See our website for admission criteria.**

## Sports Broadcasting - Grades 6-10 (Sessions 1, 2, 3)

- Campers learn the fundamentals of play-by-play and color commentary for television and radio for multiple sports, including basketball, football, baseball, hockey, and/or soccer.
- Participants use Hofstra's state-of-the-art television and radio studios to record and host their own TV shows and podcasts.

## Adrienne Clark Softball Camp

Grades 2-12 (Weeks 5, 6)

- Campers learn and practice age-appropriate techniques for fielding, hitting, throwing, catching, base running, and team play while having fun and gaining confidence in a friendly team environment.
- Bill Edwards Softball Stadium is a well-maintained NCAA Division I softball field and offers several newly designed batting cages for camper use.



## Christine Farina Cheer Camp

Grades 2-12 (Weeks 3, 4)

- Campers train with collegiate coaches to learn dances, jumps, stunts, pyramid building, and gymnastics.
- Camp sessions are held in the same first-rate indoor facilities used by Hofstra's NCAA Division I athletes.



## Danielle Atkinson Girls Basketball Camp

Grades 2-9 (Week 2) • Grades 2-12 (Weeks 4, 5)

- Hofstra Coach Danielle Atkinson and her staff lead the way in a session of enthusiastic instruction. Skill development includes small-group instruction by grade level, position breakdown, and overall fundamental skill training.
- The air-conditioned Mack Sports Complex provides numerous courts and instructional areas.



## Dennis Papadatos Boys Wrestling Camp

Grades 2-12 (Week 3)

- Campers learn the fundamentals of wrestling and practice essential drills and techniques.
- Camp sessions are held at the Teague Ryan Wrestling Complex – one of the finest facilities in the Northeast and former home of Hofstra alum and former UFC middleweight champion Chris Weidman.



## Emily Mansur Volleyball Camp

Grades 2-12 (Weeks 3, 4, 5)

- This camp focuses on age-specific fundamental skills, such as passing, setting, attacking, serving, defense, and blocking, through games and practice.
- Camp sessions are held at the air-conditioned Mack Sports Complex, with instruction provided by Hofstra's NCAA Division I coaching staff.

## Richard Nuttall and Simon Riddiough Soccer Camp

Grades 2-12 (Weeks 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6)

Grades 7-12 (Week 7)\*

- Coaches Nuttall and Riddiough encourage soccer instincts through enjoyable, small-sided games and game-related learning in a positive environment.
- The Hofstra Soccer Stadium features a 120-yard x 74-yard fully turfed field.

*\*Week 7 (August 12-16) is a speed and agility jump-start for players' school/travel team tryouts. Coaches emphasize increasing psychological game preparation skills, highlighting ball-related fitness with small-sided game play. Players will be challenged both technically and tactically to reach their full potential.*



## Seth Tierney Boys Lacrosse Camp

Grades 2-12 (Weeks 3, 4)

- With full use of Hofstra's James M. Shuart Stadium and the famed Howdy Myers Pavilion, this camp offers top-level instruction in the fundamentals of individual, group, and team lacrosse skills, while stressing the importance of sportsmanship, teamwork, and a strong work ethic.
- Players learn the fundamental aspects of dodging, passing, catching, shooting, individual defense, goalie play, and face-off technique, as well as team offense, team defense, riding, clearing, and transition play.
- Campers are placed on teams based on age and ability, but are then adjusted according to size, maturity, and skill level.



## Speedy Claxton Boys Basketball Camp

Grades 2-7 (Weeks 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7)

- Skills focus on defense, ball handling, reading screens, passing, shooting, moving without the ball, one-on-one jab series, and developing a routine.

**Grades 2-12 (Weeks 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7)**

Led by Hofstra Baseball head coach and 14-year MLB veteran Frank Catalanotto and his NCAA Division I staff, **New York Baseball Academy at Hofstra** provides players with an opportunity to develop their skills through daily position workshops, offensive and defensive technique instruction, and game play.

- Players receive hands-on instruction in a rotating series of clinics taught by Coach Catalanotto, Hofstra Baseball Assistant Coaches Rojas and Goelz, and NYBA coaches.
- Players are grouped by age and evaluated by the staff before regrouping into ability-based groups.

## CULINARY ARTS ACADEMY

### ► Culinary Arts Introduction: Apple Pie to Zucchini

Grades 7-11 (Sessions 1, 2)

- Students explore cuisines from around the world while learning proper cooking techniques, including safety, knife skills, and food preparation.
- Sessions include opportunities to practice chocolatiering and pastry arts with a professional pastry chef.

### **Forensics** - Grades 7-11 (Session 1)

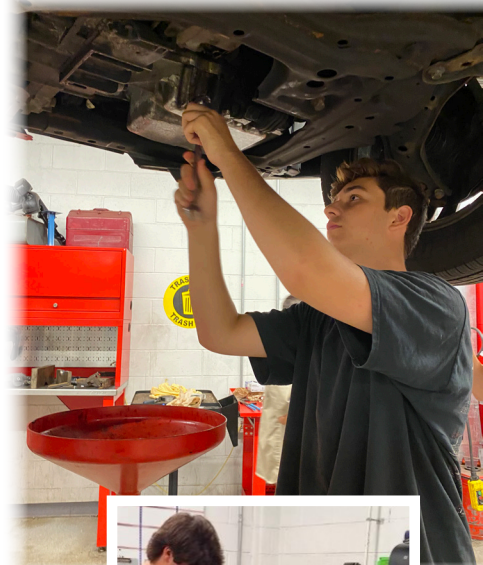
- Students discover the exciting world of forensic science through simulated crime scene investigations and by conducting various forensic science examinations.
- Participants learn how law enforcement professionals solve crimes and the importance of obtaining evidence and maintaining proper chains of custody.

- Field trips to an equestrian center and farms, along with in-house recreational projects and crafts, enhance the students' learning environment.

- Students learn about the habitats, diets, and enrichment necessary for the well-being of exotic animals.

- In this class, students use the tools and equipment in the LIHSA Fine Arts studios to design and create their own functional objects or works of artistic expression.

- Payment in full for all camp sessions is due by May 17, 2024. Any registrations received after May 17, 2024, must be paid in full at the time of registration.
- Any cancellations for a camp session MUST be made in writing and sent to ce-camps@hofstra.edu
- Any tuition paid before May 17, 2024 will be refundable less a \$125 deposit per week for all programs.
- No refunds after May 17, 2024, for any reason, including illness, injury, personal matters, missed days, transportation delays, etc. Hofstra University reserves the right to cancel any registrations if tuition is not paid in full by May 17, 2024.
- I give permission for my child to participate in off-campus trips and activities, including any that involve swimming and water activities.
