This year has seen the continued growth of our Geographic Information Systems (GIS) programs. Our new BS major in GIS will enroll our first students in the Fall. This enables students in the Natural Sciences and Computer Science/Engineering to add a skill set that is increasingly sought by employers in multiple industries. With the Department of Computer Science we have also introduced a new joint minor in Computer Science and GIS. We also substantially redesigned our BA Geography major, providing students with more diverse course options. All incoming majors now need to declare either a general Geography track or a specialization in GIS. These changes are already bearing fruit, as we have seen a very large growth in our GIS and Geography enrollments. We have also continued to adjust our Global Studies major and minor to allow students to take advantage of new courses as they are added to the Hofstra curriculum.

It is always a pleasure tracking our alumni, as they pass their professional exams, finish their graduate degrees, change careers, travel and so forth. 

- Our minors are attractive to students in the Business School, especially those majoring in International Business.








The advantages of a double major

In Spring we offer the semester-length <u>European Odyssey</u> Program



The European Odyssey is a semester-length study abroad program housed in the Department of Global Studies and Geography that is open to all undergraduate students at Hofstra. This unique program, began in 1992 and eventually expanded to become Hofstra's only semester length study abroad program. The dozen selected students and two faculty travel for 10 weeks by minivan throughout Western and Eastern Europe. The mobile classroom setting enables students to experience a rich comparative array of ten diverse countries and cultures. Participants have the opportunity to interview politicians and policy makers, professors and students, as well as ordinary citizens throughout Europe.

The focus and itinerary of the program vary each year in order to address events and issues of relevance in Europe and to how Europe fits into the broader context of increasing globalization. The courses examine geographical, historical and contemporary topics in specific countries and regions as well as in Europe generally.



Dr. Masaharu G. Inaba Memorial Endowed Scholarship




