



2020 Music Education Programs at Hofstra University AOSA Endorsed Orff-Schulwerk Teacher Education and FAME Endorsed Feierabend Courses

Enrollment Eligibility:

Any student who currently holds a bachelor's degree and is involved in the field of music is encouraged to register for these courses.

Credit:

Students may register for graduate credit and the courses are three graduate credits each. Participants who **do not** wish to receive graduate credit may register for non-credit. Please note: many school districts award "In-Service credits" or "Professional Development (PD) hours" to employees who successfully complete these non-credit courses. A certificate of completion is awarded to all credit and non-credit students upon successful completion of the course requirements. Participants should **carefully** consider whether to register for the graduate credit section or if they would prefer to enroll as a non-credit student. Those students wishing to enroll in the graduate credit section must be admitted as a matriculated or nonmatriculated graduate student and are held to the published tuition fee schedule for all graduate students.

Tuition and Fees:

Graduate credit students: Tuition is \$1398 per graduate credit. The courses are three graduate credits each. Graduate credit students must also pay a \$133 University fee.

Non-credit students: A workshop fee is \$700 per course. The Orff-Schulwerk Teacher Education Levels courses are available for 60 Professional Development hours. The First Steps in Music, Conversational Solfege and First Steps with Orff Schulwerk courses are available for 45 Professional Development hours.

Admission:

Non-Hofstra students must submit an online application for nonmatriculated graduate study through the Office of Graduate Admission at hofstra.edu/nonmatric. The application requires a bachelor's or master's degree transcript be uploaded (unofficial copies are sufficient). Hofstra students may register online through their portal.

Registration and Payment:

To register, admitted students must pay a **nonrefundable** reservation deposit of \$100 per course to register. This is deducted from the total course cost. **Deposit payment must be submitted to the Hofstra Department of Music via personal or bank check made payable to HOFSTRA UNIVERSITY.** Non-credit participants may pay the \$700 registration cost in full, or pay the \$100 deposit.
