Students intending to work toward a master's degree are urged to apply for matriculated status as soon as possible, as nonmatriculated students are limited to 12 semester hours of graduate study, unless an extension is granted by the appropriate academic dean. The Office of Graduate Admission reserves the right to enforce these requirements and all other stipulations set forth by the various academic departments.
