

# Wonder of Wonders: A Cultural History of Fiddler on the Roof

Speaker: Alisa Solomon, author

Alisa Solomon traces how and why the story of Tevye the milkman — the creation of the great Yiddish writer Sholem Aleichem — was reborn as a blockbuster musical and a cultural touchstone. She discusses how the songs have been incorporated into sacred ceremonies and hip-hop hits and how the story has inspired religious conversion and secular satire. Fiddler on the Roof — treated as an authentic historical document — has been lauded as one of the most finely wrought works for the Broadway stage.

Speaker: Lynn Torgove, singer, director and cantor

Lynn Torgove opens doors to a deeper understanding of the world of Holocaust music, drawing on women's experiences at the Ravensbrück Concentration Camp.
