Led by Kristy Caratzola, the Museum's collections manager, this session features works of art from non-Western cultures such as Japan, Africa and Mesoamerica and the musical significance of the individual objects.

Long Island and the Creative Word

Led by Kelly McMasters, Hofstra University assistant professor of English and director of publishing studies, participants study select works in the exhibition Over the River: *Transforming* Long Island and develop their own creative written responses.
