<u>Declaration of New Member Rights and Responsibilities</u>

New Members in the Hofstra University Fraternity/Sorority System have the following rights and responsibilities. This statement is to be read, understood, and practiced during the new member education process of the fraternity or sorority.

A New Member has the right:

- To disregard traditional rituals and/or acts if the New Member finds them demeaning or dangerous in any way.
- To remain an individual despite pressures to conform to group standards of one's fraternity or sorority.
- To voice complaints of the New Member program to one's brotherhood, sisterhood, the office of Student Leadership and Engagement or any other Hofstra University faculty or staff member, or the Inter/national organization.
- To not be subject to any hazing practices
 - The University defines hazing as any actions or situations that occur for the purpose of initiation, affiliation or continued members (whether recognized by the University or not) that:
 - a) Endangers mental/physical health, or involves the forced or encouraged consumption of alcohol, drugs, food, beverages, or any other substances.
 - b) Causes or may cause mental, physical, or emotional intimidation, harm or danger.
 - Involves mistreatment by playing stunts or practicing abusive, humiliating, repetitive, or ridiculous tricks that subject an individual to personal indignity.
 - d) Requires an individual to perform unnecessary, disagreeable, or difficult acts that are harassing in nature, and/or creates an environment of ridicule or criticism.

The above actions are considered hazing on or off-campus, and with or without the consent of the involved individuals.

A New Member has the Responsibility:

- To maintain his/her satisfactory academic standing with the University while undergoing the new member process.
- To refrain from questionable activities that may jeopardize or demean the image of fraternities/sororities in the Hofstra University community.
- To make a constructive contribution to his/her new member program.

It is the responsibility of the chapter officers to understand and abide by the New York State criminal codes¹:

§ 120.16 Hazing in the first degree.

A person is guilty of hazing in the first degree when, in the course of another person's initiation into or affiliation with any organization, he intentio nally or recklessly engages in conduct which creates a substantial risk of physical injury to such other person or a third person and thereby causes such injury.

Hazing in the first degree is a class A misdemeanor.

§ 120.17 Hazing in the second degree.

A person is guilty of hazing in the second degree when, in the course of another person's initiation or affiliation with any organization, he intentionally or recklessly engages in conduct which creates a substantial risk of physical injury to such other person or a third person.

Hazing in the second degree is a violation.

Examples of Hazing²

The following outlines examples of behaviors (voluntary or involuntary) that can be defined as "hazing" and will be addressed by the University. This is not a comprehensive list, it is intended to help organizations understand the broad scope of hazing behavior. Please be aware that ALL forms of hazing are taken seriously and are not tolerated by the University.

Subtle Hazing

Subtle hazing is a behavior that emphasizes a power imbalance between new members/rookies/candidates and other members of the organization. This is called "subtle hazing" because these actions/activities are often accepted as "harmless" or meaningless. Subtle hazing typically involves activities or attitudes that breach the standards of mutual respect and place new members/rookies/candidates on the receiving end of ridicule, embarrassment, and/or humilitation tactics. Some examples of subtle hazing include:

- Deception
- Assigning demerits
- Silence periods with implied threats for violation
- Deprivation of privileges granted to current members
- Assigning new members/rookies duties not required by others
- o Social Isolation
- Name Calling
- Requiring new members/rookies/candidates to refer to current member by titles (e.g. Mr./Miss)
- o Requiring items to always be in a new member's possession
- Requiring new members/rookies to dress identically
- Probate, Neophyte Show, Surfacing, Showcasing, etc., is not allowed on or offcampus.
- o Using New Member's Meal swipes for the organization's interest

Harassment Hazing

Harrassment hazing is a behavior that causes emotional anguish or physical discomfort in order to make new members/rookies/candidates feel like part of the group. Harassment hazing confuses, frustrates, and causes undue stress for new members/rookies/candidates. Some examples of harassment hazing include:

- Verbal or written abuse
- Threats or implies threats
- Line-ups, drills, or tests on meaningless information
- Asking new members/rookies/candidates to wear abnormal, unusual, or humiliating attire
- Requiring excessive or unusual physical activities or exercise
- Performing unusual or abnormal acts/skits that are degrading, crude, and/or humiliating
- o Personal servitude
- Sleep deprivation; required group sleepovers
- Deprivation of a normal hygiene routine
- Being expected to harass others

Violent Hazing

Violent hazing is a behavior that has the potential to cause physical, emotional, or psychological harm to a person. Some examples of violent hazing include:

- o Forced or coerced consumption of alcohol, drug, food, or any other substance
- Beating, paddling, or other forms of assault
- Branding or burning
- Water intoxication

- Requiring public nudity, lewd behavior, or other acts that are contrary to an individual's personal, moral, or religious beliefs
- Expecting illegal activity
- Bondage
- Abduction/kidnapping
- Exposure to extreme temperature
- Confinement within a small area

Accordingly, the University will not condone any form of hazing whether it occurs within a registered campus organization, or through membership in an unrecognized organization. As outlined in the Code of Community Standards, any student, faculty member, staff member, visitor, licensee or invitee or engages in hazing may be removed from the campus and, where appropriate, shall be subject to suspension, expulsion, or other disciplinary action.

The University reserves the right to take disciplinary action, as outlined in the Code of Community Standards of Organization, against any organizations that authorities hazing or members of those organizations (whether acting individually or in concert) who engage in any form of hazing.
