

# Student Organization Classification System

## Spring 2017

### BLUE:

**(minimum classification to be recognized as a Hofstra student organization)**

- Submit the Biannual Review Form via GetInvolvedHU by the last day of classes each semester (spring and fall).
- Make sure that organization contact information is correct with the Office of Event Management.
- Maintain accurate roster, including officers/leadership positions on GetInvolvedHU.  
Note: All registered student organizations must maintain (at all times) an up-to-date membership roster of no less than 15 members on GetInvolvedHU. The Office of Student Leadership and Engagement may grant exceptions on a case-by-case basis.
- At least one officer must be in attendance at the Fall Club Carnival and the Spring Involvement Fair.

### GOLD:

- Meet all the requirements of Blue classification.
- The organization president, vice president and treasurer (or a proxy) must attend the Fall Club Carnival and the Spring Involvement Fair.
- Send at least one member to attend an on-campus leadership conference.
- A representative must attend at least 50 percent of the scheduled presidential roundtables.
- Complete two (2) educational/leadership programs each year; these should be reported in the Annual Review. (Programs must be approved by OSLE beforehand.)
- Community Service: Organization must participate in at least one community service program each semester and log it on GetInvolvedHU.
- School Spirit: Organization should participate in at least one campus activity, including Hofstra Celebrates the Holidays, Fall Festival, Serve with PRIDE Town Wide, athletic events, open houses, Welcome Week, etc. At least 10 percent of the organization should be present. (Activities must be approved by OSLE beforehand.)
- Organization leadership meets with the associate director/assistant director or graduate assistant for the Office of Student Leadership and Engagement at least once each semester.

### PRIDE:

- Meet all the requirements of Gold classification.
- Complete two (2) additional educational/leadership programs each year. (Programs must be approved by OSLE beforehand.)
- Organizational Development: Complete an organizational assessment with the associate director and request a personalized workshop for your organization through OSLE.
- A representative must attend 100 percent of the scheduled presidential roundtables.
- Student group organizes and engages in one community service project per year; at least 30 percent of active membership must be involved in the project.
- Group participates in a collaborative program with another organization.
