

"Many of our students are motivated by the prospect of being initiated into the international geographical honor society," said **Kari Jensen**, professor of Global Studies and Geography and the faculty sponsor of Mu Kappa. "It is important for the honor society to have a presence on campus, since Geography as an academic discipline is becoming more visible."

Dr. Jensen noted that Hofstra's chapter of GTU has organized diversity dinners, book drives for colleges in several African low-income countries, and sold fairtrade chocolate. GTU) is an international honor society in Geography. The first chapter was founded in 1928 at Illinois State Normal University and Gamma Theta Upsilon became a national organization in 1931. In 1949, Gamma Theta Upsilon became an International Geographical Honor Society.

Hofstra's chapter of GTU, Mu Kappa, was founded in the spring of 2012 by Dr. Jensen. Since that time, Mu Kappa has been awarded the prestigious Gamma Theta Upsilon Honors Chapter Award six times. That award recognizes the scholarship of Hofstra's geography students, and activities that celebrate and bring awareness of geography to the university campus and community. Membership in Mu Kappa now stands at 199.
