





Over the fall semester, the Facilities and Operations Committee focused on improving campus accessibility and streamlining the process for reporting facility concerns. We conducted a campus walkthrough to assess the functionality of ADA buttons and bathroom access, partnering with the Equity and Inclusion Committee to ensure greater accessibility for all Hofstra students, faculty, and visitors. We've been working closely with Hofstra administration to address student concerns and improve the facility reporting system. We also gathered student feedback through the SAW survey, focusing on dining hours and general facility issues. The committee reported over 100 facility concerns throughout the semester!
